The item(s) listed above were observed by Section staff and require action on behalf of the facility in order to come into or maintain compliance with the Statutes, Rules, and/or other regulatory requirements applicable to this facility. Be advised that pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, an administrative penalty of up to \$15,000 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Laws, Regulations, Conditions of a Permit, or Order under Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the N.C. General Statutes. Further, the facility and/or all responsible parties may be subject to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

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ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

1. The Septage Detention and Treatment facility consist of two 15,000 gallon and one 10,000 gallon above-ground tanks for storage and treatment of domestic septage and grease trap waste.
2. The storage tanks are located at the site of a permitted septage land application site, Permit SLAS-79-04 and may be used in association with septage land application site, Permit SLAS-79-05.
3. Reviewed permit conditions and set-back/buffer requirements.
4. Approved setbacks are being met.
5. Appropriate signage (No Trespassing signs) for the site is present.
6. All weather roads are maintained for access to the site.
7. No odors observed in the area of the detention and treatment area.
8. The area around the septage detention and treatment facility was found to be clean, free of spills, and well maintained.
9. The area around the storage tanks is free of vegetative growth.
10. The left tank (15,000 gallon tank) and center tank (10,000 gallon tank) appear to be structurally sound.
11. The right tank (15,000 gallon) has weakened welding seams near the top/rear of the tank and has been taken out of service (see photo below). Plans are to schedule a welding contractor to repair the weakened seams.
12. **The 15,000 gallon storage tanks should not be used until repaired. Suggest the remaining two tanks be inspected by the contractor for seam integrity.**
