Determination of Completeness

On May 5, 2014 the Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section (Section) received your permit renewal application, entitled;

Operations Plan for the Queen City Transfer Station, Permit No. 60-14-TRANSFER-2009. Prepared for Waste Connections of North Carolina, Inc. Prepared by Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc. May 2014. DIN 20962.

The Section has performed a review of the Facility's application for a determination of completeness and determined the application is complete, in accordance North Carolina General Statute NCGS 130A-295.8(e). A determination of completeness means the application contains the required components in accordance with North Carolina Administrative Code 15A NCAC 13B .0400.

Technical Review

The following changes are requested by the Section to the submitted Plan;

1. Section 1.3 – Within this section of the Plan change the first bullet point to read, *North Carolina Administrative Code 15A NCAC 13B .0400.*
2. Section 2.0 – Within this section of the Plan add both local and regional facility contact information, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses.
3. Section 2.0 – Within this section of the Plan add a narrative describing the usage, maintenance, storage and inspection of transfer trailers.
4. Section 3.0 – Within this section of the Plan add a narrative describing the identification and handling of the following acceptable materials; asbestos, WWTP sludges, ash, and drums containing asbestos.

5. Section 9.0 – Within this section of the Plan add checklists/forms that will be filled out by facility staff documenting the areas of inspection. Space should be provided for date, staff identification and comments. Note the requested frequency;
 - a. Transfer trailers – daily (those parked on site) in accordance with item no. 2 of this letter.
 - b. Leachate and stormwater structures including but not limited to; trench drains, floor drains, tipping floor, push walls, curbs and gutters, transfer trailer parking area – daily for function and cleanliness.
 - c. Any other necessary inspections.

Submit you revised Plan to me in pdf format. All items, presented above, must be addressed, reviewed and approved by the Section prior to issuance of the Permit to Operate.
