Sanitary Landfill (Permit #03-02).

Dear Mr. McMillan,

Thank you for submitting the maps requested in my 1-14-94 letter. However, as per our telephone conversation today part of the information needed was omitted. A large scale topographic map should be prepared that clearly shows the property boundaries, permit boundaries, fill areas (past and present), existing monitoring wells, proposed upstream and downstream surface water sampling locations on both streams adjacent to the landfill, and other pertinent information. The above information should be submitted as soon as possible to further define the possibility of contaminant migration.


The map locating all private and public water supply wells within a one half mile radius of the landfill site is sufficient at this time.

As mentioned in the previous correspondence, in order to confirm and better define the types of chemical contaminants in the groundwater, the **next sampling event** should include analysis for volatile organic compounds in addition to the routine list of standard landfill parameters on all the monitoring wells and **surface water locations**. The volatile organic analysis should be done using EPA Method 8240 or 8260.
