Allegany County: Mr. Adams, County Manager, informed me that new lower reporting limits 1 ppb recently required by the "Solid Waste Division" has resulted in the detection of low levels (below 5 ppb) of several chlorinated organic constituents. Due to a higher reporting limit, these compounds were never previously detected. Vinyl chloride was detected in two wells at concentrations above the state groundwater standard (i.e., 1.9 ppb and 1.1 ppb). Since the standard for vinyl chloride is 0.015 ppb, any detection is above the standard. The vinyl chloride concentrations reported in two wells, The Allegany Landfill was closed in 1993; is this facility regulated under current subtitle D — NO regs? The lab performing the groundwater analysis has always simply forwarded the results to NCDENR. Mr. Adams saw the recent results and is asking, how will the solid waste section respond to these results? What should the County do as their next step? *See Attached Tel. Log.*
