



Dear Ms. Lestiko:

We are responding to the letter dated January 17, 1995 from you regarding the Transition Plan prepared by RS&H Architects•Engineers•Planners, Inc. We have been subcontracted to RS&H to complete the work on the Transition Plan. We have previously responded to comments from Bobby Luffy on the water monitoring and the local area study.

The particular comments of your letter are resolved as follows:

Chapter 2 - Location Restriction Demonstration

1. Documentation of the runways in the immediate vicinity of the landfill are shown on a portion of the NC Aeronautical Map for Charlotte and a portion of the USGS Quadrangle Maps for Overhill and Cliffdale. This should provide adequate documentation as noted in your letter.
2. Fort Bragg does not participate in the FEMA program; therefore, no FEMA map exists for the MSWLF area. Based on our review of the area we standby the assertion in the Transition Plan that the MSWLF is not located within a flood plain area. Please let us know if you require additional documentation on the flood plain.

Chapter 6 - Operation Plan

3. Chapter 6 has been revised to address the items in Rule .1626 noted in your letter. Revised Chapter 6 is enclosed for your use.

Chapter 7 - Closure Plan

4. & 5. RS&H is currently under contract with Fort Bragg to develop a new cap design for closing out the MSWLF. We anticipate completion and submittal of the design by December 31, 1996. That plan will address the comments of this portion of your letter.

Chapter 8-Post-Closure Plan

6. Gas monitoring frequency is spelled out in the Gas Monitoring Plan to be done quarterly. We have revised this chapter to comply with that plan.

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
7. Certification information has been added to Chapter 8. Revised Chapter 8 is enclosed for your use.


Dear Mr. Rawls:

Rule .1603(d)(2)(A) of the North Carolina Solid Management Rules directs that the Division will determine the adequacy of all Transition Plans by October 9, 1996. Furthermore, in accordance with Rule .1601(c)(4), MSW Landfill Units that have not demonstrated the adequacy of their plans by this date are constituted as "Open Dumps" and must be closed under both state and federal law.

As of this time, the Division has not been able to complete it's review of the above referenced Transition Plan. A response to the Division's review letter of January 17, 1995 needs to be submitted in order to complete the review process.

Please submit all required information to the Division by September 1, 1996 in order for a timely review to be completed prior to the October 9, 1996 deadline. If you have any further questions, please contact Susan Leistiko at (919) 733-0692 extension 262.
