The item(s) listed above were observed by Section staff and require action on behalf of the facility in order to come into or maintain compliance with the Statutes, Rules, and/or other regulatory requirements applicable to this facility. Be advised that pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, an administrative penalty of up to \$15,000 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Laws, Regulations, Conditions of a Permit, or Order under Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the N.C. General Statutes. Further, the facility and/or all responsible parties may be subject to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

**ADDITIONAL COMMENTS**

1. The facility is a Municipal Solid Waste Transfer Station which began operations November 2, 2004.
2. Approved disposal location for the waste transferred from the facility is the Uwharrie Environmental Landfill, Montgomery County, Permit # 62-04. Approved alternate disposal sites include Charlotte Motor Speedway Landfill, East Carolina Regional Landfill, Upper Piedmont Regional Landfill, and Foothills Regional Landfill.
3. The permitted service area for the transfer station is defined as all North Carolina counties within a 50-mile radius of the facility, and includes the counties of: Alamance, Cabarrus, Caswell, Chatham, Davidson, Davie, Durham, Forsyth, Granville, Guilford, Harnett, Iredell, Lee, Moore, Montgomery, Orange, Person, Randolph, Rockingham, Rowan, Stanley, Stokes, Surry, Wake, Wilkes, and Yadkin.
4. The approved location for maintenance of facility operational records is on site at 2104 Bishop Road.
5. Conducted review of the facility Permit to Operate, Operation Plan and Operational Records required by permit and approved plans.
6. A 10 year permit was issued August 18, 2014 which included an updated Operation Plan (May 2014 revision) in conjunction with permit renewal.
7. The facility receives and transfers an average of approximately 400-500 tons per day of municipal solid waste. For the month of November 2014 the facility received 9,976.65 tons of municipal solid waste.
8. Annual Facility Report review for the FY2013-2014 reporting period indicated the facility has received 133,198.69 tons of waste. The majority of the waste received by the facility is generated in Guilford County (121,691.09 tons) with remaining tonnages from Alamance, Davidson, Orange and Randolph Counties.
9. The facility receives single stream collected recyclables (Guilford County residential curbside and commercial recycling routes) which is loaded into trailers and shipped to the Hickory recycling processing center.
10. The facility sent 333.67 tons of collected recyclables to Hickory for the month of November 2014.
11. Reviewed current random inspection/waste screening program and random reports for random inspections conducted by the facility. Random inspections are conducted at a rate of one per day (six per week), insuring a minimum of one percent of incoming loads are inspected.
12. Republic Services staff conducts internal monthly Transfer Station and Facility inspections (Facility Inspection Report) for safety and environmental compliance issues as stipulated in the approved Operational Plans (Section 9.0). A company internal safety and operation audit was being conducted at the site at the time of this inspection.
13. Reviewed training records for facility staff. Training records include the following SWANA operator certifications: Eric McAden, Transfer Station Operations Specialist- expiration date 06/22/15; Byron Moore, Transfer Station Operations Specialist- expiration date 06/22/15; Anthony Perez, Transfer Station Operations Specialist- expiration date 06/22/15. Additional facility operators are being scheduled for training courses.
14. Reviewed transfer station wash-down and cleaning logs, as required by the site Operational Plans.
15. The facility also utilizes an outside contractor for a periodic complete floor-to-ceiling power washing. Reviewed invoices for the contracted cleaning services which are typically conducted 4 times per year. The last invoice on file was for the contracted cleaning conducted 11/11/14.
16. The facility has proper signage at the entrance of the facility as required by Solid Waste Rules.
17. Observed transfer station operations.
18. Incoming waste was being processed and loaded into transfer trailers at the time of the inspection.
19. No odors were observed in areas outside the transfer station building.
20. All waste is removed from the tipping floor at the end of each day, and the tipping floor is cleaned daily.

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21. The loading bay for the transfer trailers is periodically cleaned of litter during each operation day.
22. Areas behind tipping floor barriers and the transfer trailer loading bay were free of accumulated debris.
23. Leachate and waste water generated by the transfer station is collected via a sanitary sewer system to the City of Greensboro Waste Water Treatment Plant.
24. Observed staging and parking areas for loaded transfer trailers. There was no evidence of previous leachate leaks from parked transfer trailers or loaded transfer trailers currently on site.
25. Windblown materials and litter at the site is well controlled, roadways and fence lines were clean of windblown litter. The facility has recently purchased a mechanical sweeper for cleaning roadways and parking areas.
26. There are containers on site for collection and storage of metals, wood pallets, and tires, which are removed from incoming waste during the individual load screening process.
