Dear Mr. Myrick:

On January 15, 2014, Mary Whaley and Ben Barnes, representing the State of North Carolina, Division of Waste Management Solid Waste Section, inspected the above referenced facility for compliance with North Carolina solid waste statues and rules. You were not present to represent this facility during this inspection. The following violations were noted:

- A. 15A NCAC 13B .0566 (4) Adequate soil cover shall be applied monthly, or when the active area reaches one acre in size, whichever occurs first.**  
There was not any soil cover and it appeared that there has not been any cover since the site was started.
- B. 15A NCAC 13B .0566 (3) Solid waste shall be restricted to the smallest area feasible and compacted as densely as practical into cells.**  
There were piles of waste in several areas on the property
- C. 15A NCAC 13B .0566 (9) Access roads shall be of all-weather construction and properly maintained.**  
The access road was extremely muddy in a couple of areas.

**COMPLIANCE SCHEDULE**

Based upon the foregoing, Summit LCID shall come into compliance by **March 3, 2014** with all requirements of the regulations in **15A NCAC 13B .0566 (4)**, **15A NCAC 13B .0566 (3)** and **15A NCAC 13B .0566 (9)** by completing the following:

“Corrective Actions”

1. The debris at the site, including the concrete, brick and block, must be covered with adequate soil coverage.
2. There were several piles of waste, which must be consolidated into small cells and compacted as densely as practical.
3. The access road must be repaired to be of all- weather construction and maintained.
4. Permanent, clearly visible edge of waste markers must be established.
5. There must be a sign at the gate showing a contact name and an emergency contact number.
6. The miscellaneous unacceptable material must be removed and taken to a permitted facility.

Summit LCID shall provide a written certification with supporting documentation on company letterhead confirming the noted compliance schedule has been completed. Include in this certification any actions taken to prevent these deficiencies from occurring in the future. Mail this certification to Mary Whaley, PO Box 59, Oxford, NC 27565 by the noted compliance date.

Failure to comply with this schedule may subject the facility and/or all responsible parties to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22(a) and 15A NCAC 13B .0701-.0707, an administrative penalty of up to \$15,000.00 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Laws, Regulations, Conditions of a Permit, or an Order issued under Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the N.C. General Statutes.
