Dear Mr. Myrick:

On February 3, 2014, the Solid Waste Section (Section) issued a Notice of Violation letter to Jason Clyde Myrick regarding facility violations. The specific violations listed were 15A NCAC 13B references: .0566 (4) *Adequate soil cover shall be applied monthly, or when the active area reaches one acre in size, whichever occurs first*, 15A NCAC 13B .0566 (3) *Solid waste shall be restricted to the smallest area feasible and compacted as densely as practical into cells* and 15A NCAC 13B .0566 (9) *Access roads shall be of all-weather construction and properly maintained*.

The Solid Waste Section conducted follow-up inspections of the site on May 20, 2014. Due to the fact the violations noted in the February 3, 2014 letter have not been corrected at this time, you are hereby notified that the Section intends to move forward in the enforcement process.

In order to potentially abate any further action forthcoming, it is recommended that the following actions be taken **within the next 30 days** of receipt of this notice:

Corrective Action

The items listed above were observed by Section staff and require action on behalf of the facility

and/or all responsible parties in order to come into or maintain compliance with the Statutes, Rules, and/or other regulatory requirements applicable to this facility. Be advised that pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, an administrative penalty of up to \$15,000 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Laws, Regulations, Conditions of a Permit, or Order under Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the N.C. General Statutes. Further, the facility and/or all responsible parties may also be subject to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

We solicit your cooperation and would like to avoid taking further enforcement actions. At the same time, it is your responsibility to comply with the requirements of the General Statutes and/or the North Carolina Administrative Code.
