
As we discussed last week, Pace Analytical Services (Pace) inadvertently omitted the required Appendix II analyses of Semivolatile Organic Compounds (SVOCs) from the October 2001 Semi-Annual Water Quality Assessment at Jackson County. Altamont, on behalf of Jackson County, proposes to resume analyses of SVOCs in October 2002.

Review of Appendix II data from previous sampling periods, 1999 and 2000, shows that SVOCs have not been detected at the facility during water quality monitoring conducted by Altamont Environmental, Inc. (Altamont). Appendix II data previous to 1999 are not known to exist. In addition, detections of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) during the current period were similar in number and magnitude to detections of VOCs during earlier sampling periods. Taken together, these facts suggest that there are no significant changes in either the extent or magnitude of contamination at the site.

If you have questions or comments regarding the request to resume SVOC sampling in October 2002, please contact me at your convenience. In the absence of correspondence from the Solid Waste Section, Jackson County will proceed with sampling in accordance with the Solid Waste Regulations and the request included in this letter.
