Dear Mr. Dunham:

On May 8, 2014 in a phone call, you requested a change in the cropping system for Septage Land Application Site covered under Permit # SLAS-25-08. The request was to change from coastal bermudagrass (hay) / cereal rye (hay) to millet (hay) / cereal rye (hay) for Fields 1 and 2. You also requested to open Field 3. Based upon the nutrient management plan you submitted on November 8, 2013 for permit renewal, the Division of Waste Management approves the use of millet as a summer crop and cereal rye as a winter crop, to be grown for hay on Fields 1 and 2.

Field 3 is currently listed as inactive in the permit. Therefore, Field 3 must be inspected by the Division for compliance with NC Septage Management Rules, permit conditions, and the nutrient management plan prior to use. The current permit and nutrient management plan has a cropping system of millet (hay) and cereal rye (hay) for Field 3. Please notify me at least two (2) weeks prior to when you would like to have the field open.

This letter serves as a modification to Permit SLAS-25-08 issued on December 17, 2010. Please keep this letter with your current permit as documentation of the crop change for Permit SLAS-25-08. Remember that violations to the NC Septage Management Rules or your permit could subject you to administrative penalties of up to \$15,000 per violation per day.
