**RE: Reopening of Fields 1, 2, 3a, and 3b at SLAS-67-11  
Ray's Septic Service  
SR 1221 in Onslow County**

Dear Mr. Zamora:

On May 1, 2014, I inspected septage land application site, SLAS-67-11. Upon inspecting the bermudagrass coverage in the five fields, Fields 1, 2, 3a, and 3b have sufficient bermudagrass coverage to be reopened for septage applications. Beginning with our phone conversation on June 9, 2014, Fields 1, 2, 3a, and 3b have been open to receive septage. Be sure to follow the permitted application rates for each field listed in Condition 7 of your current permit and the monthly application rates listing in your nutrient management plan. Do not go over your permitted amounts.

Field 4 is to remain closed to septage applications. The bermudagrass coverage observed on May 1, 2014 was not sufficient enough to open Field 4 to septage applications. However, you may apply fertilizer to help establish the bermudagrass. Be sure to keep up with the amount of nitrogen you apply to the field. Do not apply more nitrogen than what your nutrient management plan suggests. Please contact me when you would like to schedule an inspection of Field 4 for bermudagrass coverage.

**Again, Fields 1, 2, 3a, and 3b have been opened to septage applications. Field 4 is to remain closed at this time. Remember that violations to the NC Septage Management Rules or your permit could subject you to administrative penalties of up to \$15,000 per violation per day.
