ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

- 1) This Facility is a Large Type III Solid Waste Compost Demonstration Project.
- 2) This Facility is permitted to receive for composting, hardwood and softwood sawdust, animal bedding, ground corn cobs, ground and un-ground yard waste, Septage and FOG wastes (dewatered grease trap residuals and Septage), floating fatty solids from animal processing or transportation, clean unfinished wallboard, wood pallets with nails removed, clean untreated wood scrap, pre and post-consumer source controlled food wastes, vegetative agricultural products, tobacco waste, hay and other forage, corn stover, cotton gin trash, peanut hulls, landclearing debris, water treatment lime mud, and non-toxic/no-hazardous coal combustion dust.
- 3) The hours of operation for this Facility are Monday through Saturday 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM.
- 4) This site is secured by a locked cable type gate at the Facility entrance and has controlled access for safety.
- 5) The cable was unlocked and the attendant was on-site during this Facility Compliance Inspection.
- 6) The Facility access road is of all-weather construction and is well maintained at this time.

- 7) Access around the Facility is stable and no areas of erosion were noted during this Facility Compliance Inspection.
- 8) Personnel were on-site conducting grading and maintenance operations during this Facility Compliance Inspection.



- 9) The waste types at the Facility were reviewed and no unpermitted wastes were observed this Facility Compliance Inspection.
- 10) All feedstock, mixed compost, and finished product are being maintained in separate areas to prevent mixing and/or contamination of finished product as required.



- 11) All Facility operations are being maintained in accordance with the approved Demonstration Plan.
- 12) All liquids are being contained within the concrete bin receiving area.
- 13) Compost operations were underway during this Facility Compliance Inspection.
- 14) The compost windrows are turned and aerated using a Midwest Bio-Systems Aeromaster PT 130.
- 15) Adequate distance is being maintained between and around the windrows for fire suppression and proper mixing.



- 16) Windrows are marked with numbered stakes placed at the end of each row for proper monitoring and accurate data recordation.

- 17) The compost log, documenting observed compost process temperatures and product turning/aeration activities, was in order and reviewed during this Facility Compliance Inspection.
- 18) The final compost product is screened for size before distribution. Fines are distributed as compost while larger, coarse particles are cycled back into the compost process.



- 19) No violations were observed during this Facility Compliance Inspection.
