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ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

1. All photographs were taken by Troy Harrison on November 10, 2015.
2. The Septage Land Application Site consists of Field 1 (2.1 acres) and Field 2 (1.2 acres) for a total of 3.6 usable acres.
3. The site is permitted for land application of domestic septage.
4. The site had accessible all-weather roads to the septage land application field covered under the permit.
5. Appropriate signage was displayed at the site.

6. Both fields had disposal area boundaries that were well delineated with permanent markers which corresponded to the site map.

7. All septage discharges appear to have been made within the disposal area boundary. No recent septage application were observed.
8. No evidence of standing liquid or pooled waste was observed. The waste appeared to be evenly distributed throughout the field.
9. No objectionable odors were observed.
10. The nutrient management plan appears to have been followed on all fields with a good crop stand of fescue. There was evidence of recent reseeded.

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11. Site logs were not reviewed at this time.

12. Soil samples were collected from the field. The check for soil sampling was received.
