I am in receipt of the Notice of Violation (NOV) for the referenced site which was received at my office in Charlotte on March 25, 1992, via Exxon's Construction and Maintenance Engineer in Raleigh, North Carolina, Mr. Bill Cook.

The submittal of a Tank Excavation Assessment Report for the subject site is the basis for this NOV. This report was submitted to your office on December 19, 1991. See attached copy of cover letter. Please note that the Greensboro site report was included with site reports for Thomasville and Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Based on the submittal of this report, Exxon feels that the NOV is not applicable and should be revoked.

Exxon's concern now is that you do not have the report in question. Therefore, I am enclosing a duplicate copy of the Tank Excavation Assessment Report for your review. I understand that the Guilford County Health Department is stewarding this site and has also requested a copy of the report. 





NOTICE OF VIOLATION OF SUBCHAPTER 2N
 CRITERIA AND STANDARDS APPLICABLE TO
 UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS

Dear Sir:

On September 13, 1991, this office observed the removal of an underground storage tank (UST) at the subject location. A site assessment was due for the subject site on October 13, 1991. To date no report has been received. The subject site is currently in violation of North Carolina Administrative Code (NCAC Title 15A Subchapter 2N "Criteria and Standards Applicable to Underground Storage Tanks"). It is our understanding that you and/or your firm are the owner/operator of the UST System. If you feel that you are not responsible for the following violations, please notify this office within seven (7) working days.

The violation(s) is(are) as follows:

- Failure to submit site investigation results following permanent closure as outlined in 15A NCAC 2N .0405, within 14 days of receipt of this notice, you must:
- (a) provide to this office the above cited report or
 - (b) file a notice of intent to permanently close the UST system and proceed with said closure or (c) present documentation explaining why the tank is exempt from these requirements.



Failure to comply with any of the aforementioned criteria and standards shall result in enforcement action against you which may include: (1) a civil penalty assessment of up to \$10,000 for each day of continuing violation (NC G.S. 143-215.6), (2) criminal penalty proceedings under circumstance as outlined under G.S. 143-215.6B, (3) referral of your site to the Federal Trust Fund which must seek cost recovery from responsible parties for any and all expenses incurred, (4) a request to the Attorney General to institute an action for injunctive relief and, (5) the issuance of a special order.

It is your responsibility to comply with these criteria and standards. Copies of 15A NCAC 2N are available at this office.
