I have reviewed the Soil and Groundwater Assessment Report submitted for the Initial Site Sampling Plan for the former Carolina Chemical Corporation facility in response to the IANOV Docket Number 2006-203.

This report documents contamination remaining at your site that is not within the scope of the Compliance Branch of the Hazardous Waste Section. The immediate threat related to containers of waste and the


abandoned chemical storage building has been abated. The remaining contamination in the soil and groundwater is not accessible by the general public and is therefore not an immediate threat. The probable age of the contamination is outside of the jurisdiction of the Hazardous Waste Section. The site is therefore being referred to the Inactive Hazardous Sites Branch of the NC Superfund Section.
