
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Report:

On December 14, 2012, Mr. Hunneke responded to a complaint regarding numerous containers of various sizes believed to be holding hazardous waste stored at the subject property and a bad smell emanating from same. The complainant is the owners' next door neighbor. The subject property is a residence located in a residential subdivision in Greenville, North Carolina. Mr. Cox has a landscaping business and occasionally stores his equipment at the property.

On the day of the inspection, numerous containers were observed at the subject property ranging in size from 4-gallon poly backpack type sprayers to an approximately 30-gallon poly drum designed to be placed on a trailer or truck bed. Mr. Cox explained that all containers were used to transport and deliver chemicals used in landscaping including fertilizers and pesticides. All containers observed were empty. No odor of chemicals was noted during the inspection. Mr. Cox showed where he kept his light landscaping equipment (weed whackers, etc.) under cover of an approximately 15-foot x 25-foot tarp in the back yard. No containers of chemicals used or otherwise were observed on the property. No used oil was observed and no gasoline was observed. The only other containers observed were several open top trash cans, all empty.

No further action appears warranted at this time.
