The best answer I can give right now is possibly. There was previously an agreement between Sunoco and Flint Hills that Flint Hills would handle everything on the east side of the road and Sunoco would handle everything on the west side of the road. Where that stands now I don't know. But neither site is a priority right now, so we aren't telling anyone what to do at this time. Flint Hills has been talking with Kim Caulk about entering the REC program, but haven't yet. I sent out the letters because Kim wanted to make sure that we had it on record that they had the most up-to-date information on their responsibilities and choices for proceeding with cleanup. Hope that helps.
