

Reason for visit: Complaint Investigation: **FCI-CMP**

Inspector responded to a complaint of pits dug into the ground filled with formaldehyde or some other type of chemical used to treat lumber.

REPORT:

The subject site is a 34-acre parcel used to stage, grade and prepare logs, primarily higher grade large timber for shipment. On the day of the investigation, the inspector arrived alone to a deserted "yard" area that had been graded and had some gravel applied to make the muddy terrain passable. Other than a small office type trailer, the only other structure was a storage trailer. An approximately 250-gallon diesel tank was observed, staged on a concrete secondary containment slab along with a 55-gallon drum containing a non-toxic wax based substance that is typically painted onto the ends of logs to prevent checking or cracking of the timber during storage and shipment. No evidence of staining, spills leaks or pits of any kind were observed. No strong chemical odor was noticeable in fact quite the opposite. The area appeared clean and well managed with no adverse conditions or areas of concern noted or observed. It would appear that this complaint is without significant merit. No further action is required.
