REPORT:

CVS is a retail drug store that also sells general merchandise. Some merchandise that is to be disposed must be disposed as hazardous waste.

The facility generates pharmaceutical waste such as empty containers, dropped tablets and pharmaceuticals returned by customers. Also, nicotine patches are disposed when they expire.

A compliance assistance visit was conducted to assist the facility in compliance with LQG regulations.

Number of employees – 30

Water and sewer – Municipal

Acreeage – Business is on a downtown city lot

Nearest residence – Estimated over ½ mile

Wastes that are generated include:

D001 – Hazardous waste liquid (alcohol)

D002 – Waste corrosive liquid (sodium hydroxide)

D001 – Aerosol waste

P001 - Warfarin

Transporters – Freehold Cartage – NJD054126164
Stericycle – MNS000110924

TSDFs – Stericycle- INR000110197

The facility has a hazardous waste storage area in a back area of the store. Damaged items are scanned to determine if they must be disposed as hazardous waste. General merchandise that must be disposed as hazardous waste is stored in 8-gallon (approx. size) cardboard containers on the shelves.

Requirements discussed include adding an evacuation map to the contingency plan with two routes of evacuation from the storage area and a description of the signal to evacuate. Also, aisle space and container management was discussed.

CONCLUSIONS:

A compliance assistance visit was conducted to discuss and review compliance with LQG requirements. An inspection will be conducted at a later date.
