SUBJ: Request for Identification of North Carolina Applicable or Relevant and Appropriate Requirements that Pertain to the Cristex Drum Superfund Site, Oxford, Granville County, North Carolina

Dear Mr. Mattison:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), under the authority of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980 (CERCLA), as amended by the Superfund Amendment and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA), has initiated a Remedial Investigation (RI) and Feasibility Study (FS) for the Cristex Drum Site located in Oxford, Granville, North Carolina. The RI has been prepared by Black & Veatch Special Projects Corps and the Feasibility Study is forthcoming.

This correspondence requests that the State of North Carolina identify all State Applicable or Relevant and Appropriate Requirements (ARARs) that may pertain to the Cristex Drum Superfund Site, in Oxford, Granville, North Carolina. Potential ARARs are state environmental or siting laws that are promulgated, more stringent than federal requirements, timely identified to EPA, and applicable or relevant and appropriate to the Site. See 42 U.S.C. § 9621(d)(2)(A); 40 C.F.R. §§ 300.400(g); 300.415(j).

It would be appreciated if you could respond by October 30, 2016. In your response, please include citations to the specific State standards. EPA will evaluate the information you provide to determine whether the standards qualify as State ARARs. EPA will confer with you as necessary in making this determination.
