

The term "brownfields" refers to previously used properties that may lie vacant because potential contamination makes them unmarketable to the private sector. EPA has recently announced a comprehensive Brownfields strategy, including Pilot grants to municipalities, to stimulate economic revitalization.

Enclosed herewith is the Phase I, Screening Site Investigation Report by HDR Engineering, Inc. for Overcash Machine Shop, Inc. (NCD 003 520 301).

Based on the information for the subject site, The North Carolina Superfund Section has recommended that a Phase II, Screening Site Investigation not be performed at this time.


The above recommendation is based on:

- Overcash's process has and still does generate three waste streams; waste cutting oils, excess paint and thinners, and metal shavings.
- Petroleum based cutting oils were used from the 1950's through the mid-1970's. Water-soluble non-toxic lubricants were substituted for the petroleum based cutting oils subsequent to that period. The waste oils and metal shavings are presently co-disposed at the county landfill. The metal shavings have always been disposed of at the landfill, but there are several piles of shavings still present at various points around the property. Earlier waste oil disposal practices included dumping on the ground and/or open burning at the facility.
- Paint and paint thinner wastes are generated from limited painting operations at the facility. Waste paint and thinner

- generation is approximately two to three gallons per month. Prior to 1982, these materials were dumped and burned on-site. Presently, these wastes are drummed and disposed of off-site.
- It is believed that any organics in the paint and thinner burned on-site, were most probably volatilized or destroyed, but there are most probably residual inorganics left in the soils. These levels should not be high due to the limited amount of paint and thinner burned on-site.
 - There are no critical habitats for endangered species within 15 miles downstream of the site.
 - There are several areas of hydric soils within four miles of the facility.
 - There are approximately 2151 residents relying on ground water within three miles of the facility. The nearest well is believed to be approximately 0.75 miles from the site.
 - There are no surface water intakes within 15 miles downstream of the site.



- ✓ 1. It is not clear how the value for Distance to Nearest Well/ Population Served in the Ground Water Route Score Sheet was derived. Amend the text of the report and the HRS accordingly, if applicable.
- ✓ 2. It is believed that the value for Permeability in the Ground Water Route Score Sheet is incorrect based on five (5) feet per day. Amend the text of the report and/or the HRS accordingly, if applicable.
- ✓ 3. It is not clear how the value for Facility Slope and Intervening Terrain in the Surface Water Route Score Sheet was derived. Amend the text of the report and the HRS accordingly, if applicable.
- ✓ 4. It is not clear how the value for Distance to Nearest Surface Water in the Surface Water Route Score Sheet was derived. Page (8) states that Third Creek is 1.8 miles south southeast of the property. Amend the text of the report and the HRS accordingly, if applicable.
- ✓ 5. It is not clear how the value for Surface Water Use in the Surface Water Route Score Sheet was derived. Page (11) states that Third Creek is used for irrigation, recreational boating and fishing (Ref. 4). This reference is suspect, as well. Amend the text of the report and the HRS accordingly, if applicable.

On June 26, 1990, the Overcash Machine Shop facility was visited by Grover Nicholson of the North Carolina Department of EHNR, Division of Solid Waste Management, and Gardner Strasser of HDR Engineering, Inc. The information in this report is based on statements given by the persons named in this report.

SITE VISIT

A 0900 hours, the inspection team visited the Overcash Machine Shop and spoke with Sandra Harris, president, and Willard Overcash, owner. The inspection team, after brief introductions by both the inspection team and the facility president, were escorted on a tour of the facility.

SITE LAYOUT

The Overcash Machine Shop facility manufactures metal parts for the furniture industry, small truck beds, waste paper machines, heat-a-laters, and wrought iron frame parts. The facility is located on approximately 0.35 acre of land southwest of Statesville. The facility address is 865 Connor Street, Statesville, Iredell County, North Carolina. The facility consist of one large building which covers most of the property. The facility is south of Connor Street, west of Drake Street, and north of Industrial Boulevard. On the south side of the property, between Industrial Boulevard and the property boundary, is a demolition debris landfill. On the east side of the building an underground gasoline storage tank is buried, the capacity of the tank is unknown. On the west side of the building are two fuel storage tanks. The property slopes to the south, with an average elevation of approximately 900 feet above mean sea level.

OWNERSHIP HISTORY

A review of a survey drawing, dated November 13, 1958, indicates several owners of the property prior to the final purchase by Overcash Machine Shop. The property owners include Mr. Davison, Mr. Bunton, Mr. Lutz, Mr. Murdock, and one unknown person.

SITE USE HISTORY

Prior to the construction of the Overcash Machine Shop, the property was used for farming and pasture land. The land has not been used for disposal or burial of waste. The property was graded level using on-site fill from the higher areas.

PROCESS AND WASTE DISPOSAL HISTORY

The Overcash Machine Shop is a manufacturer of metal parts. The manufacturing process generates waste paints, paint solvents, cutting oils and lubricants, and metal cuttings. The metal cuttings are collected and transported to the Iredell County Landfill. In the past, paint sludges and paint solvents were collected, thrown on the ground, and burnt. In January of 1982, the practice of burning the paint sludge and solvent was discontinued. At present, paint sludge and solvents are collected in drums and removed from the facility by the paint supplier.

REMEDIAL ACTIONS TO DATE

There have been no remedial actions at this facility.

DESCRIPTION OF EARLIER REPORTS

There have been no reports or investigations conducted on this facility.

WINDSHIELD SURVEY

The facility is located in a commercial/industrial area, but residential property is located to the west along Connor Street.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

On June 26, 1990, the inspection team visited the City of Statesville Public Works Department and obtained a map of the City Water System, dated June 12, 1972. The map did not indicate when it was updated.

On June 26, 1990, the inspection team visited the West Iredell Water Company and spoke with Mr. Samuel Hindman, Manager. Mr. Hindman was able to provide us with a map of the piping system for the West Iredell Water Company distribution system. The pipe lines were drawn in on a North Carolina Department of Transportation Highway map, dated January 1, 1984.





The purpose of this letter is to notify you that the above-referenced site has been included on a list of sites for which Superfund site screening investigations will be conducted within the calendar year.

The North Carolina Superfund Section, pursuant to the authority and requirements of G.S. 130A-310.22 and the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980 (CERCLA), 42 U.S.C. 9601 et seq., as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA), Public Law 99-499, is responsible for conducting site screening investigations at sites reported to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as posing a potential hazard to public health and the environment through the release, or threat of release of hazardous substances to the environment. The purpose of the investigation is to determine whether the site contains hazardous substances which have or might contaminate the soil, surface water, groundwater or air and thus pose a hazard to public safety or the environment. These investigations are not emergency situations, but are normal steps in the evaluation of all such sites reported to EPA.



The above-referenced site is one of 75 which the EPA has requested that the Superfund Section investigate within the next year. To assist us in conducting these investigations, the Superfund Section intends to hire one or more private contractors to perform a portion of these investigations under State supervision. Before any investigative activities are actually conducted at the site, you will be notified of the date of the inspection and specific activities to be conducted. These activities may include:

- 1) inspecting, sketching and photographing the premises;
- 2) collecting of surface and subsurface soil samples;
- 3) collecting sediment samples;
- 4) air monitoring;
- 5) collecting groundwater and surface water samples;
- 6) hand augering boreholes and emplacing temporary monitoring wells;
- 7) conducting geophysical surveys; and
- 8) transporting equipment onto and about the site as necessary to accomplish the above activities, including trucks and sampling equipment.



Mr. Jack Doloboff of Waste Management, Inc., reported that a subsidiary had transported waste types reportable under "Superfund" to the above landfills in Buncombe County. As the documentation shows the CERCLA Notifications were filed in "Good Faith" but, no particular incident or waste type was ever cited as having been disposed of at any of the above landfills. All available records were reviewed and all persons involved were interviewed. All of the landfills/dumps have been closed-out by the State except the Buncombe County (191) Landfill, which is operating with a State permit. In 1982, those sites which were conducive to water sampling (4 sites) were sampled with no unusual results being recorded. Therefore, due to the lack of collaboration or verification of the alleged activities of Waste Management Subsidiaries, and the nature in which the disposals took place, we will recommend that until the landfills in question cause more concern or until more supportive documentation is obtained, the landfills in question be placed on the inactive ERRIS List. This is not to say that we either agree or disagree with any of the parties involved, but that more information would be needed in order to make any further investigations of the landfills worth while or cost effective at this time. We recommend no further action is required and that the above mentioned landfills be placed on the Inactive ERRIS List.

Mr. Micheal Cunningham of Carolina Log Buildings, Inc. reported that about 440 gallons of a 5% pentachlorophenol, 95% varsol mixture was stored on the property after changing to another wood preservative product. In the past couple of years they have treated several wooden structures on their property with the mixture to preserve the buildings and to try and properly use up the remaining mixture. The water well on the property has been analyzed yearly since 1979 with no contamination being found. The only reason that a notification was filed was because when they were informed of the filing deadline it was 24 hours away and they were unable to find out that they really did not need to file.

Based on our review of the available data we have concluded that Carolina Log Buildings, Inc. is not a hazardous waste disposal site, no further action is recommended and that they be placed on the inactive ERRIS List.

Sandra Harris of Overcash reported because of a paint thinner (Oxyoul) that was used by the company when they did any painting. This site was inspected under RCRA in January 19, 1982, and was determined not to be a problem.

Although there were some discrepancies in the records concerning the past activities at the site, the small amounts involved would not present a problem. Past activities were alleged to have included open air burning of solvents, petroleum base cutting oils and some paint residues. Paint residues were also placed in the "trash". This is a very small operation at present and only operates part-time.

Based on our review of the available data we have concluded that Overcash Machine Shop is not a hazardous waste disposal site, no further action is recommended and that they be placed on the inactive ERRIS List.

Mr. D. H. Stassfort notified of routine solid waste was disposed of in garbage collection containers on site. Not hazardous waste.

Based on our review of the available data we have concluded that Estech General Chemicals is not a hazardous waste disposal site, no further action is recommended and that they be placed on the inactive ERRIS List.

All activities at this site are under RCRA, after November 19, 1980.

In 1981, the site was used to manufacture and paint various containers. According to Mr. Teague of Container Products, paint clean-up residues and empty paint drums were reported on a 103c notification, as F017 waste (now an EPA suspended waste). All of the materials and empty drums were removed to the present company operations at 112N College Road in Wilmington. The empty drums have since been recycled and the remaining clean-up wastes is being processed for proper disposal under RCRA. The 23rd street site is now the location of a major movie studio company.

Based on our review of the available data we have concluded that the Container Products, 23rd Street location is not a hazardous waste disposal site, no further action is recommended and that it be placed on the inactive ERRIS List.

Thomas Gallagher of Dow Corning, notified that they were storing 330 gallons of PCB contaminated oil in drums above the ground in compliance with Federal PCB regulations. Mr. Bill Bryan of Dow Corning, furnished documentation supporting that the drums had been properly disposed of and that no PCB's were being stored on site at the present. This is a RCRA facility.

Mr. E. Bodsey of Kock Asphalt (formerly Kopper's Company) reported the landfilling of solidified asphalt at a "dump" known to him as Budd Lee Paving Company site. He reported because of the filing deadline and not being sure of their "status". It has been documented that the asphalt, without petroleum solvents or other cut-back materials, is not hazardous waste and can be landfilled. Our investigation did find out that the "illegal" dump was cleaned-up and closed by Mecklinburg County in 1983. The impounded water in the area was also tested by the State and was found to be fine.

Based on our review of the available data we have concluded that the "site" is not a hazardous waste disposal site, no further action is recommended and that it be placed on the inactive ERRIS List. I would also like to recommend that this site be entered as the Eddie Mattox Dump, Tom Sadler Road, Charlotte, N. C. 28214. This is the way Mecklinburg County and the N. C. Division of Environmental Management have it in their files. This site has been recorded on the deed of the property.




An investigation and inspection were made at this facility on January 11, 1984, to determine if this facility is a hazardous waste generator and if they had any past on-site dump areas.



An interim status inspection of Overcash Machine Shop, Inc. indicates that this facility generates about 2-3 gallons per month of a flammable solvent used to clean a paint line and a paint gun. The solvent is sold as S-4Xylol. Mrs. Harris stated that this waste was usually thrown out on the ground behind the company's building. Mrs. Overcash was immediately advised to discontinue this practice and seek assistance from someone in the area, who also generates waste solvent, in properly disposing of the waste. Mrs. Harris also stated that the company may discontinue buying this product from Warlick Paint Company in Statesville.

Overcash Machine Shop manufactures metals parts basically for the furniture industry and generates no other waste other than routine solids. This facility will request to be removed from the list of hazardous waste generators in North Carolina.
