SUBJECT: United House of Prayer Drum Site

Mr. Bill Klutz, EPA Region IV (404/347-3931) was contacted on this date concerning the subject site. Mr. Klutz reported that this site was located on property owned by the city of Salisbury immediately south of the parking lot for the United House of Prayer. The site consisted of 13 drums of liquid in the flood plain of a small creek. Mr. Klutz worked with the Fire Chief for the City of Salisbury to have the drums stabilized and moved to the city landfill. Samples were collected of the contents of the drums. Analysis of these samples indicated that the drums contained soap and rain water. The pH ranged from 3.5 to 5. A complete hazardous substance profile was run on the liquid from the drums and no hazardous substances were found. At EPA's recommendation, the drums were emptied at the landfill, crushed and disposed of in the landfill. Mr. Klutz strongly recommended no further action at this site.

Captain Allan L. Eudy, Salisbury Fire Department (704/638-5351), was contacted on this date concerning the subject site. Captain Eudy reported that the address from the phone book for the United House of Prayer was 501 Concord Road. He added that the church was actually on what is now called Boundry Street. On the 1962 USGS topographic map this is called Green Street, and the church is near the corner of Green and Hurah Street. Captain Eudy agreed to mark the location of the church and drums that were removed from the subject site on a map and mail us a copy. For further information he said we should contact Chief Lackey.
