DISCUSSION:	
<p>I told Terry that John Walch had received his message and had asked me to call him back. Terry said that he understood that the ammonia levels onsite needed to be at or below the background levels, though he wasn't sure that Kyle Cox understood. Terry said that GRI had sampled the site this month and the ammonia levels were a little lower than they were in October 2008 but still 2-3 orders of magnitude higher than background levels.</p> <p>He said that Kyle Cox had told him that John Walch had said that if the ammonia levels at the site were below 210 µg/L, then the site could be closed. I said that was true, but one of the concentrations onsite in October 2008 was 14 mg/L, which was well above 210 µg/L. Terry said that he told Kyle that he would just be wasting \$500 at this time since we were unlikely to close the site at this time. I explained that 210 µg/L wasn't an actual standard, but since we had used it at other sites we wouldn't make them clean up below that level. Terry responded that he wasn't that familiar with the levels at the site since he was just filling in for Nicole, but he would take a look at the data. I said okay.</p>
