DISCUSSION:	
<p>Mr. Worley said that GRI had sent NFA request in October and wondered when they would get a response. I said that I didn't recall receiving an NFA request. I told him that my notes said that had received a monitoring report, but that the ammonia levels were still above 2L and background. He said that maybe there hadn't been an actual NFA request, but the report had said that the levels weren't above 2L. They want to get the site closed out. I said that if they wanted to submit an actual NFA request there would be a fee of \$500, since some remedial action had been done at this site, in that at least one AFVR event had been conducted. I told Mr. Worley that they could send their request and the fee to me. They just needed to make sure to put the ID number and/or name on the check. He asked if I needed anything else. I said no, we should have the entire file here which is what I would need. I then stated that I wasn't sure that that the site would be closed out based on my notes. I admitted that I hadn't looked at the report since it came in and didn't have it in front of me, so I couldn't confirm that. I said that I could look again and offer my opinion as to whether I thought it would be closed. He said that he didn't want to waste his \$500 so if I could do that he would appreciate it. I said okay.</p> <p>I called Mr. Worley back and said that I had reviewed the report and that the ammonia in MW-2 was above the 2L and background levels at the site. The ammonia 2L is 1.5 mg/L, which isn't listed in the report, and the highest background level was 0.15 mg/L. MW-2 had an ammonia concentration of 2.1 mg/L. We would not close it with those levels. I also couldn't say whether the site had been adequately assessed or whether getting the contaminant levels down in MW-2 would be enough. I told him that they had the option of entering the site into the REC program. They would then hire a consultant that is registered with us and the consultant would direct all cleanup and it would be considered to have state approval. I can't tell them not to do work out there, so they also have the option of conducting whatever additional assessment and cleanup they want without state approval. He said okay.</p> <p>Mr. Worley later left a message saying that he couldn't find ammonia standard. He also said that the property is an old farm site and that his brother still farms it and uses nitrogen fertilizers at the property.</p>
