Randy,

I just looked over the two Phase 2 reports for the subject property. The reports indicate that the property was always used as a gas station so there would be no onsite source of the PCE. However, it appears that the site was also used for auto repair. Auto repair facilities are frequently sources of chlorinated solvents in groundwater. The solvents were generally used for cleaning parts at these facilities. Given the direction of groundwater flow depicted in one of the reports and the assumed general flow toward the river, the property to the north of the site would unlikely be the source of the PCE on this property. We would need more data before I would accept that the source of PCE is offsite. Thus I will have to send out a new site letter to the owners of the property. Let me know if you have any questions.
