Dear Mr. Strickland: RE: Disposal of Hazardous Waste

Earlier this Spring I wrote to you concerning a client of mine who was engaged in preliminary negotiations with Union Carbide of Asheboro, North Carolina with respect to disposal of hazardous waste. You corresponded with me under date of May 29, 1979 with respect to the classification of waste contained in a schedule provided to you.

It has become apparent to me that it will be necessary for my client and me to procure copies of all applicable rules, regulations, and legislation concerning the disposal of hazardous waste so that we might be in a position to negotiate a reasonable and fair contract to all parties. I would appreciate it if you would contact me concerning the procurement of all rules, regulations and legislation applicable to the appropriate and legal disposal of hazardous waste. We are attempting to negotiate a contract concerning the price for the disposal of this waste but this is impossible without knowing what responsibilities and obligations the hauler will encounter under applicable rules, regulations and legislation.

Incidentally, my client is Mr. Bill Maness of Montgomery Garbage Service and he indicated to me that he attended a meeting in Winston Salem earlier this year in which you addressed the group and said he received very informative information.

I am thanking you in advance for your assistance and cooperation in this matter and I am awaiting to hear from you concerning the requested information at your earliest possible convenience.

SCHEDULE "A"

DESCRIPTION OF WASTE

1. Scrap Alkaline Batteries and Cells 50%

Cells and batteries may be in complete or partially complete state and have the following general chemical composition:

Manganese Dioxide	32%
<u>Zinc</u>	13%
Cellulose Gum	0.5%
Cement	0.5%
Carbon	4%
<u>Mercury</u>	0.5%
Steel	30%
Brass	1%
Potassium Hydroxide	15%
Misc. - paper, plastic, petroleum products, water	3.5%

NOTE: Potassium Hydroxide, used with water as the cell electrolyte, is strongly alkaline. Leakage from cells or batteries should not be touched. Scrap cathodes and occasional scrap anode mixes are included in this figure.

2. Paper-Based Scrap 42%

Bags, cartons, liners, poly-coated kraft, slip sheets, and misc. paper products

3. Steel-Based Scrap 4%

Steel banding, covers, cans, parts from recovery operations, steel webbing

4. Wood-Based Scrap 2%

Broken pallets, packing material, wood scrap

5. Miscellaneous 2%

Plastic parts, sweeping compound, asphalt, etc.

NOTE: Scrap removed from the premises will be at \$50.00/load. Load tickets must be signed by Union Carbide representative and submitted along with the monthly invoices. This price is subject to revision based on labor and operating costs of the Contractor. However, Union Carbide must be provided 60 days notice prior to any rate increase. In the event that this increase is not acceptable, the Contract will become void.

2. The County now provides container service for rural residents. This is a new service. As people become familiar with this service, the litter problem should be reduced.
3. A copy of the report was left with Mr. Ernest Perry, Sanitarian, Montgomery County Health Department. Mr. Perry agreed to contact Mr. Chisholm regarding the names of people responsible for the litter problem.
