Dear Mr. Williams:

Your letter of intent with regards to the Sampson County Solid Waste Management Program has been reviewed and evaluated by the members of staff. As a result of these evaluation within the concept of State regulations, the following conclusions and variances have been determined and permitted:

(1) Your intent to operate a central sanitary landfill located on S.R. 1302 in full compliance with the Division of Health Services Rules and Regulations to serve Clinton, Roseboro, Salemburg and all industries in the area of the towns stated above, plus all contract haulers and public schools, is acceptable. You and your Board are to be congratulated for this major step in solving the solid waste disposal problem in your County.

(2) Your request to operate a maximum of six satellite sites in accordance with the Division of Health Services Rules and Regulations is granted with the following conditions:

(a) A variance will be granted in Section XI - E, daily cover requirements, to require covering three times one week and twice the following week with six inches of compacted earth on all six sites.

(b) A variance will also be granted in Section XI - M requiring an attendant on duty while a site is open for public use on the sites of Ingold, Ivanhoe, and Suttontown.


All variances granted are for a one year period terminating on July 1, 1975. Prior to this date, a study should be made to determine the most feasible method for bringing the Sampson County solid waste program into full compliance.

Sampson County Solid Waste Management

Gentlemen:

It is the intent of the Sampson County Board of County Commissioners to operate a Solid Waste Management Program as follows:

1. Prepare, open and operate a sanitary landfill on SR1302, consisting of ninety three acres, in accordance with regulations adopted pursuant to Article 13B of Chapter 130 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

This landfill to be known as a central site and will serve Clinton, Roseboro, Salemburg and all industries in the area of the towns stated above, plus all contract haulers and public schools.

2. Operate six satellite sites, permitting coverage North and South of Highway 24 on alternate days.
 - a. Keener Site (SR 1820)
 1. That covering be required no more than three times one week and two times the following.
 2. This landfill will serve the town of Newton Grove and parts of Newton Grove, Halls and Westbrook townships.
 - b. Spiveys Site (SR 1634)
 1. That covering be required no more than three times one week and two times the following.

2. This landfill will serve parts of Newton Grove, Westbrook, Herring, Plainview and Mingo Townships.

c. Mt. Gilead Site (US 421 S)

1. That covering be required no more than three times one week and two times the following.

2. This landfill will serve part of South Clinton, Lisbon and Taylor's Bridge Townships.

d. Ingold Site (SR 1142)

1. That covering be required no more than three times one week and two times the following.

2. That site attendant not be required.

3. That landfill remain open 24 hours a day.

4. This landfill will serve parts of South River, McDaniels, and Lisbon Townships including the Town of Garland.

e. Ivanhoe Site (SR 1100)

1. That covering be required no more than three times one week and two times the following.

2. That site attendant not be required.

3. That landfill remain open 24 hours a day.

4. This landfill will serve Franklin Township.

f. Suttontown Site (SR 1730)

1. That covering be required no more than three times one week and two times the following.

2. That site attendant not be required.

3. That landfill remain open 24 hours a day.

4. This landfill will serve Piney Grove Township.

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Letter of Intent

Request the modifications for a period of not less than two years, during which a thorough study of Solid Waste Management will be made.

Request that the above plan be accepted for Solid Waste Management in Sampson County.


