Dear Mr. Lefler:

Preliminary investigation of the old landfill site listed as the Environetics Burn Site (NONCD0000410) performed by Marshall Miller & Associates, Inc. (MM&A) on behalf of the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources (NCDENR) determined that the Site was used for disposal of industrial and commercial wastes. This site is not believed to have been used by any municipality or Lincoln County, rather as a pit in which industrial and commercial wastes, including drums of solvents and bottoms, were incinerated.

According to the *Preliminary Engineering Report, Solvent and Bottoms Destruction Facility, Environetics, Inc. Site, Lincoln County, North Carolina* dated July, 1976, and filed at the NCDENR, Division of Solid Waste office in Raleigh, North Carolina, the Site was designed to incinerate approximately 6,500 55-gallon drums of solvents, bottoms, and residues generated by various industries and collected by Hughes, Inc. A subsequent *Report of Investigation or Inspection of Environetics Burn Site*, dated September 13, 1976, likewise filed at the NCDENR,



Site Location Map




NCDENR/OLD UNLINED LANDFILL ASSESSMENTS

REPORT:

This is to confirm that on September 10, 1976, all ash from the Jadco/Environetics Burn Site, SR 1354, Lincoln County, N. C., was removed from the burn pit, mixed with portland cement, allowed to harden for 24 hours and placed in the Gaston County Landfill at Gastonia. All burned drums have been sold as scrap to local scrap dealers according to Mr. Charles Milford, President, Environetics Company. The burn pit has been covered with clean fill and the site has been closed.
