Dear Mr. Lamb:

We have reviewed your asbestos operations plan dated February 16, 2011, regarding the East Carolina Environmental Landfill. The scope of work for this project will be to disturb the existing landfill in order to expand the gas collection system by drilling and trenching. The result of this activity will most likely disturb asbestos-containing material during the drilling operation. After reviewing your asbestos operations plan we have the following comments that need clarification before completing our review of the plan.

1. Provide a point of contact, physical address, mailing address and telephone number for East Carolina Environmental Landfill.
2. Provide a point of contact, physical address, mailing address and telephone number for Republic Services of NC, LLC, and other associated parties involved with this project.
3. Provide information regarding the requirement to have temporary barriers and appropriate signage to demarcate the area where asbestos-containing waste is being disturbed.
4. Provide written procedures as to how the drilling contractor will protect his/her employees while disturbing the asbestos-containing waste throughout the process until completion of the project.



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

5. Provide information regarding how the contractor(s) will protect the public from being exposed to asbestos-containing waste throughout the process until completion of final disposal.
6. Provide a schematic drawing identifying the locations of the existing wells, future wells and trenching locations.
7. Identify if the landfill is a municipal landfill or a construction & demolition landfill.
8. Provide the approximate length of trench work to be completed and place the approximate locations on the schematic drawing.

In closing, we look forward to working with your industry regarding the recycling of landfill gas while at the same time protecting the public health and the environment from potential exposure to asbestos.
