
In response to the Notice of Violation issued on September 2, 2011, I am writing to address the action items found on pages 2 and 4 as follows:

1. As of this date, we have not located any written documentation approving the cessation of water quality monitoring at the landfill. However, conversations with Mr. Bill Perry (OmniSource) and Mr. Mike Tant (W.Z. Baumgartner) indicate that verbal approval was granted during meetings with Solid Waste Section personnel in 2005. It is our opinion that the existence of this approval is supported by the wording of permit (34-20) condition number 3. This approval was to last until a new monitoring plan could be submitted and approved by the Solid Waste Section - the plan was submitted in May of 2005 but has never been approved or commented on by the Solid Waste Section.
2. As the existing monitoring network was deemed unacceptable six years ago (see permit condition number 3), we will submit a revised Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation / Sampling and Analysis Plan by October 6<sup>th</sup>. Once the plan has been approved by the Solid Waste Section, monitoring wells will be installed, developed and sampled. A summary report of the analytical results will then be submitted within 60 days of receipt.
3. Not applicable.

4. If analytical results obtained from the new monitoring network dictate, we will submit an Assessment Plan pursuant to 15A NCAC 2L .0106(d)(2).
