Dear Mr. Carroll and Mr. Waldrop:

The Solid Waste Section has reviewed the *Assessment Monitoring Plan* submitted in December 2006 on behalf of ReUse Technology Inc. by Sherrill Environmental, Inc. for the Swift Creek Project Highway 301 located in Nash County. The *Assessment Monitoring Plan* was submitted pursuant to a Compliance Order With Administrative Penalty issued by the Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section to ReUse Technology, Inc. on September 15, 2006.


The *Assessment Monitoring Plan* consists of determination of groundwater flow direction and rate, determination of horizontal and vertical extent of the contaminated plume, installation of one shallow groundwater monitoring well, groundwater and surface water sampling, groundwater and surface water analyses, and a schedule for implementation. As a result, the *Assessment Monitoring Plan* is approved as described with one exception: Section 3.0 of the Assessment Monitoring Plan states, "Data will be reported in Semi-Annual Reports for a period of five (5) years." However, the Solid Waste Section will determine if further water quality monitoring would be required for the site after five years. Water quality monitoring will be required at the site until there is no evidence that the site is affecting groundwater and surface water.

Please also refer to the October 27, 2006 North Carolina Solid Waste Section memorandum titled, "New Guidelines for Electronic Submittal of Environmental Data" for new information regarding groundwater and surface water sampling analyses, electronic submittal, and reporting form submittal. Analyses of groundwater and surface water will be reported to the method detection limit.

Pursuant to the September 15, 2006 Compliance Order, "Within sixty (60) days of satisfactory completion of all elements of the assessment plan, Full Circle Solutions shall submit a final report. The report shall include a method to remediate the groundwater contamination. The Division shall review the report and may request more information or amendment as it deems necessary."
