

Thank you for your letter concerning the Bass Mountain Stump Dump on Bass Mountain Road in Alamance County, North Carolina.

Although it is not within the jurisdiction of the department to regulate the roadways or traffic at solid waste management facilities, I asked the Division of Waste Management to send a representative to visit the facility to determine if there were any solid waste violations occurring at the site.

The field staff member who inspects sites in Alamance County observed no solid waste violations at the Bass Mountain Stump Dump at the time of his inspection. He noted that the road to the landfill was heavily graveled and of all-weather construction.

Mr. Thomas E. Berry has recently contacted our office regarding the Bass Mountain Stump Dump. Wild Horse Canyon Road is a private road maintained by all property owners. For years, Mr. Berry and his neighbors have maintained this road without incident.


Mr. Wolfe opened an inert debris landfill which is currently being operated on 1.98 acres of land. Since the landfill is being operated on a tract of land under 2 acres, Alamance County guidelines are not applicable. In order to have access to a road more convenient to the 90 acre tract of land where the stump dump is located, he purchased at least one lot on Wild Horse Canyon Road. Since Mr. Wolfe has opened the Bass Mountain Stump Dump, the road has deteriorated, and the neighbors have been experiencing health problems due to the excessive dust that is generated by the dump trucks using Wild Horse Canyon Road.




