Dear Ms. Broadway,

The Yancey Mitchell Transfer Station's floor is beginning to show extreme wear. Cracks, which have appeared in the floor, are being eroded further by the gravel and debris that comes to the floor from the gravel road entrance. The floor someday soon will need to be repaired or replaced.

However additional floor wear can be slowed down and the time for needed repair/replacement could be extended if the entrance road was paved. I understand there is a enterprise fund which has been established using tipping fees for the repair and maintenance of your facility. I would like to suggest that this would be a good use for those funds. When the floor is repaired/replaced the paved road surface would extend the life of the new surface. Maintenance and longevity of equipment would also benefit. Dust control would cease to be a problem and the maintenance of the road itself would be reduced.

I would encourage both counties to consider paving the road this spring.
