

CONDITIONS OF PERMIT

OPERATION:

1. This facility is permitted to receive solid waste as defined in G.S. 130A-290(35), except that hazardous and liquid wastes are prohibited from acceptance at this facility.
2. This facility may receive solid waste that is generated within the service area described in Appendix I of this document and shall dispose of said solid waste at Sampson County Disposal, Inc.(Permit # 82-01 or 82-02) in Roseboro, Sampson County, North Carolina, Red Rock Disposal (92-28) Holly Springs, Wake County, North Carolina or Coble's C&D Landfill (01-05) Liberty, Alamance County, North Carolina. **SEE APPENDIX 1 ON PAGE 6 OF THIS PTO THAT ADDRESSES WASTE DISPOSAL SERVICE AREAS FOR THE REFERENCED LANDFILLS.**
3. This permit shall be reviewed every five (5) years, on or before 23 September 2010 in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .0201(e) & (f) and G.S. 130A-309.06(b). Modifications shall be in accordance with the Rules in effect at the time of review.
4. This permit is for operation of the transfer facility in accordance with the approved plans. Any revisions or modifications to these plans shall be approved by the North Carolina Solid Waste Section.
5. Operation of the facility shall occur in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .0402, "Operational Requirements for Transfer Facilities", the revised operational plan Permit Submittal Document dated 5 November 2002 and these additional requirements:
 - a. The owner or operator of a municipal solid waste management facility shall not knowingly dispose of any type or form of municipal solid waste that is generated within the boundaries of a unit of local government that by ordinance:
 - I. Prohibits generators or collectors of municipal solid waste from disposing of that type or form of municipal solid waste;
 - II. Requires generators or collectors of municipal solid waste to recycle that type or form of municipal solid waste.
 - b. On or before 1 August 2003 (or at an earlier date as requested by the Division), the owner or operator shall report to the NC Solid Waste Section, for the previous year beginning 1 July and ending 30 June, the amount by weight of the solid waste that was received at the facility and disposed of in a landfill, incinerated, or converted to fuel. To the maximum extent practicable, such reports shall indicate by weight the COUNTY of origin of all solid waste. The owner or operator shall transmit a copy of the report to the county in which the facility is located and to each county in which waste originated.

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CONDITIONS OF PERMIT

OPERATION:

- c. Waste shall not be stored on the "tipping floor" after operating hours. Waste can be stored in transfer trailers, in the facility with covers in place, after operating hours, but no longer than 48 hours.
- d. The "tipping floor" and "transfer trailer loading area" shall be maintained in a sanitary, clean condition after operating hours in accordance with the revised Operational Plan that is part of the Permit Submittal Documents dated 5 November 2002.
- e. Incoming C&D waste shall not be placed on the apron, outside of the transfer station roof area, if raining. Waste placed on the apron area shall be sorted and placed in containers at the end of the working day. Waste inside the building shall be managed according to the operations plan.
- f. Absorbents or other products shall be used to collect liquids that the C&D waste produces, that are placed on the apron area.
- g. If liquids from the C&D waste are not managed properly, then the ability to manage the C&D waste outside of the covered transfer station area(s) will be rescinded.
- h. Segregated materials shall be placed in containers as soon as possible to eliminate materials coming in contact with water.
- i. Concrete, asphalt and clean wood (non-treated, stained or painted) shall be placed in the storage areas, as shown on the site map dated Sept. 2002, at the end of the working day, if not in containers.
- j. Laminated materials (plywood, oriented strand board/OSB, engineered lumber, etc.) can be processed and stored for boiler fuel at this time(based upon the letter from Guy Shavender Trucking dated 24 October 2002). If in the future the boiler fuel market declines, other uses such as composting or plywood/OSB manufacturing may be markets that this material could be utilized.

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- k. If demolition waste is received, an asbestos screening plan shall be in-place. If suspect waste containing asbestos (old shingles, floor tile, ceiling tile, laminate/veneer flooring, etc.) is received, light wetting of the waste may be necessary to eliminate visible dust emissions. Contact Jeff Dellinger at 919-733-0668 to develop a asbestos screening and management plan and submit the approved plan to the Solid Waste Section within 90 days.

Jim, As a follow up to my voicemail to you yesterday, I just wanted to make sure that you understood Waste Industries will also want to continue to utilize the Durham Transfer Station when necessary to transfer C&D to Red Rock Landfill from the Counties that are currently specified in the Red Rock Service Area. According to the Red Rock Permit, these counties are Wake, Durham, Franklin, Granville, Nash, Chatham, Johnston, and Harnett. Efforts are currently underway to secure the Wake County approval to add to the Red Rock service area certain counties not listed above. Until the Wake County approvals are secured, C&D from those counties not listed in the Red Rock Permit Service Area can go to Sampson or Coble when applicable.

Thanks for the email concerning the renewal of the transfer station permit in Durham. A issue that needs to be addressed, before the permit to operate can be renewed, is the proposed service area request. First, Red Rock Disposal (92-28) doesn't have approval to take waste from Orange and Alamance counties (service area is Chatham, Durham, Franklin, Granville, Harnett, Johnston, Nash and Wake). The Section needs for the transfer station operations plan to address how waste from these counties will be handled. Sampson County Disposal (82-02) has a state wide service area that can accomodate this request. Second, the request could be amended to remove Orange and Alamance from the request and renew the PTO for the Durham transfer station.

The following is concerning a request for permit change for our transfer station located at 210 Stone Park Court, Durham, NC 27703 (permit #3214-T). Upon review of this permit, we are requesting the following change to the operation plan of this transfer station. This change is:

1. Alamance, Chatham and Granville Counties have been added to the service area of this transfer station.

All other conditions of the permit will remain as they were listed in the current permit:

1. The site is still a solid waste transfer station used to handle solid waste generated by the company's customers in Wake, Orange, Durham, Alamance, Chatham, and Granville Counties.
2. Waste Industries is still the owner/operator of the facility on 210 Stone Park Ct..
3. The primary disposal sites for this transfer station are the Waste Industries Sampson County Landfill (permit #8202) and the Red Rock Disposal C&D LF (permit #9228).
4. Since the original permit was issued on April 4, 2001, only approved operational changes have been conducted at this site.

Please advise on any other written requests that might be required in order to have the permit changed for the transfer station located at 210 Stone Park Ct., Durham, NC. If no other documentation is required, please send the adjusted permit to my attention at the address below.
