**ATTACHMENT 3**  
**Conditions Of The Permit**

**GENERAL FACILITY:**

1. This facility is permitted to receive solid waste as defined in G.S. 130A-290(35), except that hazardous and liquid wastes are prohibited from acceptance at this facility.
2. This facility may receive solid waste that is generated within Forsyth, Alamance, Alexander, Alleghany, Cabarrus, Caswell, Chatham, Davidson, Davie, Guilford, Iredell, Randolph, Rockingham, Rowan, Stokes, Surry, Wilkes, and Yadkin Counties, North Carolina and shall transport that waste to Republic Services' Uwharrie Regional Landfill, Permit No. 62-04, located in Montgomery County, North Carolina. Alternate disposal sites for waste leaving the transfer facility are Republic Services' Upper Piedmont Regional Landfill, Permit No. 73-04, located in Person County, North Carolina and Republic Services' Foothills Regional Landfill, Permit No. 14-03, located in Caldwell County, North Carolina; except that waste shall not be transported to a receiving municipal solid waste landfill facility that is not permitted to accept it.
3. This permit shall be subject to review in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .0201(e) on or before September 13, 2012. On or before June 12, 2013, the owner shall submit a request for review and shall update pertinent facility plans including the facility operation and waste screening plans.
4. If the performance and compliance history of this facility is determined to have been satisfactory by a review by the Division, and no permit revisions are required, a representative of the Section shall inspect the facility and issue an approval to continue operation for five (5) additional years under the terms and conditions of this permit. The Section representative shall notify the Permitting Branch Supervisor in writing, either by letter or e-mail, that the conditions have been met. The owner and operator shall be copied on the correspondence. The notification shall suffice as permission to operate as of the date of the notification.
5. The owner or operator of a municipal solid waste management facility shall not knowingly dispose of, or accept for transfer for subsequent disposal, any type or form of municipal solid waste that is generated within the boundaries of a unit of local government that by ordinance:
  - a. Prohibits generators or collectors of municipal solid waste from disposing of that type or form of municipal solid waste.
  - b. Requires generators or collectors of municipal solid waste to recycle that type or form of municipal solid waste.

6. The facility operator shall have completed an approved operator training course in compliance with G.S. 130A-309.25.
  - a. A responsible individual certified in transfer facility operations shall be on-site at all times during all operating hours of the facility at all times while open for public use to ensure compliance with operational requirements.
  - b. All pertinent transfer facility operating personnel shall receive training and supervision necessary to properly operate the landfill units in accordance with G.S. 130A-309.25 and addressed by memorandum dated March 1, 2004.
7. All sedimentation and erosion control activities shall be conducted in accordance with the Sedimentation and Pollution Control Act, 15A NCAC 4, and all applicable permits shall be secured prior to construction.
8. This permit is not transferable.

**Operational Conditions:**

10. Operation of the facility shall occur in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .0402, "Operational Requirements for Transfer Facilities", and the approved operations plan, Attachment 2, Document 5. Any revisions or modifications to these plans shall be approved by the NC Solid Waste Section.
11. Floor drains, leachate collection devices, sanitary sewer connections or leachate storage tanks for the collection and disposal of wash down water and leachate shall be operational. The tipping floor shall have positive drainage away from the building entrance and toward the sump in the loading pit or a trench drain shall be installed along the entrance to the tipping floor and connected to the leachate collection system.
12. This facility shall be operated in a manner which is consistent with the State solid waste management plan and with the solid waste management plans that have been adopted by those units of local government served by the facility and approved by the Section.
13. Waste shall not be stored on the "tipping floor" after operating hours. Waste can be stored in transfer trailers, at the facility with covers in place, after operating hours, but no longer than 48 hours.

14. The “tipping floor” and “transfer trailer loading area” shall be maintained in a clean, sanitary condition after operating hours and shall be cleaned at least daily in accordance with the approved Operational Plan.

**RECORDKEEPING AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:**

15. A copy of this permit and the approved plans shall be maintained at the facility.
16. Fires and non-conforming waste incidents shall be reported to the Solid Waste Section within 24 hours, and a written notification submitted within 15 days.
17. On or before August 1 (or at an earlier date as requested by the Division) of each year, the owner or operator shall report to the NC Solid Waste Section, for the previous year beginning July 1 and June 30, the amount by weight of the solid waste that was received at the facility and disposed of in a landfill, incinerated, or converted to fuel. To the maximum extent practicable, such reports shall indicate by weight the COUNTY of origin of all solid waste. The owner or operator shall transmit a copy of the report to the county in which the facility is located and to each county in which waste originated.
18. The owner shall pay the permit application fee for a permit amendment for a transfer station of \$3,000.00. The permit fee must be paid by November 1, 2007. If it is not paid by this date the permit will be automatically terminated.
