Dear Mr. Perry,

After reviewing the most recent sampling event on July 26, 2002 submitted to the Solid Waste Section dated August 21, 2002, there were a few concerns. Please respond to these concerns.

- There was no indication as to what approved Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) analytical method was used to perform the various analyses.
- Which environmental laboratory was used to perform the analytical methods and is this laboratory certified for North Carolina?
- It was noticed that a new well, MW-1R, was installed to replace MW-1. Is this new well at the same depth and close proximity to the old well? When was the well installed? Submit the well construction record for MW-1R and the abandonment record for MW-1.
- Explain the high pH reading in monitoring well MW-1R.
- Explain the high concentration of chloride in monitoring wells MW-3 and MW-4.

In addition to these concerns, a closure plan with a groundwater assessment plan needs to be presented to the Solid Waste Section sometime in the near future. In the groundwater assessment plan, state which EPA methods will be used, which laboratory will be used, a detailed plan groundwater monitoring and submit any appropriate well construction records and/or abandonment records.

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
