ATTACHMENT 2 Conditions of Permit

General

1. This permit approves the construction of a regulated medical waste treatment facility consisting of two 3500 pounds per hour BondTech Autoclave Units and associated facility appurtenances for storage and processing of treated and untreated regulated medical waste. The BondTech Autoclave Units will be installed successively as demand for services increases. BMWNC, Inc. shall notify the Solid Waste Section 30 days prior to installation of each successive unit.
2. The approved plans are described in Attachment 1. Where discrepancies may exist, the most recent submittal and Conditions of Permit shall govern.
3. This permit will be subject to review every five years as per 15A NCAC 13B .0201(c), according to the issuance date of the Solid Waste Permit, Part 2 - Permit to Operate. Modifications, where necessary, shall be required in accordance with Rules in effect at the time of review.
4. This facility is permitted to receive medical waste as described in the approved plan, and as defined in 15A NCAC 13B .1201 (4), with the exception of pathological wastes. Hazardous wastes, radioactive wastes, lead acid batteries, non-processible wastes, and other wastes that may pose a threat to public health or the environment, are prohibited.
5. This facility is subject to the requirements of all applicable sections of the most recent version of the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules, 15A NCAC 13B, and the specific conditions contained herein.
6. Medical Waste is subject to the general requirements of 15A NCAC 13B .1202.
7. Regulated Medical Waste is subject to the requirements of 15A NCAC 13B .1203.

FACILITY CONSTRUCTION CONDITIONS

8. Construction of the facility shall be in accordance with the pertinent approved plans as described in Attachment 1, "Approved Documents".
9. Additional conditions and revisions of the approved documents or changes during construction require approval by the North Carolina Solid Waste Section.

FACILITY PRE-OPERATIVE CONDITIONS

10. Prior to receiving waste at this facility, a Permit to Operate must be obtained from the Solid Waste Section in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .0201(b).
11. The following requirements shall be met prior to waste acceptance at this facility:
 - a. The facility shall be constructed in accordance with the approved plans and the conditions specified herein.
 - b. Facility inspection shall be made by a representative of the Solid Waste Section.
 - c. A pre-operative meeting shall be held on-site with key facility personnel and representatives of the Solid Waste Section.
