You are hereby advised that, pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, an administrative penalty of up to \$5,000 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Statute or Regulations. If the violation(s) noted here continue, you may be subject to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

**Compliance Order Issued December 8, 2006 resulting from March 28, 2006 inspection, Status:**  
Settlement agreement awaiting signature by WCA (As per 7/30/07 correspondence from WCA legal representative to Attorney General's office).

**AREAS OF CONCERN AND COMMENTS:**

1. The facility consists of a Construction and Demolition Waste Treatment and Processing Operation and a Construction and Demolition Landfill.
2. The facility began operations on February 15, 2004.
3. The site is permitted as MRR of High Point, LLC. The facility was purchased by Waste Corporation of America (WCA) and now is operating under the name WCA of High Point, LLC as of April 1, 2005. A request for a name change and modifications to the Operation Plans was by submitted by WCA. Permit re-issuance is currently under review by Solid Waste Permit Section.
4. The facility has submitted (May 2006) CQA documents for the constructed cells #4 and #5 in the Construction and Demolition Landfill.
5. Available permitted space for landfill disposal (cells #1,2,3) is approximately 60-75 days as of July 10, 2007, based on normal incoming tonnage rates.
6. Service area for the facility originally included Guilford County and portions of Davidson, Forsyth, and Randolph Counties as specified in the franchise agreement with the City of High Point. The service area was amended at the High Point City Council meeting of May 3, 2004 to include all of Guilford, Davidson, Forsyth, and Randolph Counties.
7. The High Point City Council has passed the new franchise agreement (name change clarification) on November 16, 2006.
8. Reviewed the most recent semiannual monitoring report on file for the sampling conducted on January 16, 2007.
9. Monitoring wells were observed to be locked, labeled, and are on concrete pads. The last monitoring event was conducted June, 2007.
10. Reviewed operational records for the facility including tonnage reports (incoming and outgoing materials from the reclamation operations, landfill disposal).
11. The facility receives approximately 300-350 tons per day. Review of tonnage reports for June 2006 indicated 7,200.48 tons of waste received (incoming) and 294.36 tons outgoing from treatment and processing operations.
12. Reviewed training/operator certification records. The landfill operator certifications on file: James Swaney- Landfill Operators Certification, expiration 10/08/07; Mike McFeeley- Certified Landfill Manager, expiration 02/22/08; Clyde Herrin- Landfill Operators Certification, expiration 10/08/07; Joe Richardson- Landfill Operators Certification, expiration 10/08/07; Andy Tucker- Landfill Operators Certification, expiration 02/28/09.
13. The facility conducts random inspections at both the landfill and treatment and processing operation locations. Reviewed the random inspection reports for both areas. The random inspections are being conducted one per day for both locations. The facility also maintains "Load Refusal Records" for incoming loads of waste, which were turned away from the site. Reviewed recent load refusal records.
14. Observed Construction and Demolition landfill operations.
15. Currently operating in the permitted cells 1-3 areas.
16. Windblown materials effectively controlled and collected.
17. Working face observed to be small, well controlled, and well compacted. Excellent cover from recent daily operations. Intermediate cover and seeding has been conducted on areas not currently being utilized. Vegetation has been established on side slopes.

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- 18. Erosion control measures and sedimentation basins well maintained, no off-site erosion noted.
- 19. Observed completion of repairs on the south side slope of the landfill. These areas were noted in the previous inspection as possibly requiring addition soil cover or repair to prevent potential seepage of leachate during wet weather events.
- 20. The facility has commenced methane sampling for the landfill. Methane sampling was conducted July 2, 2007.
- 21. Roadways well maintained throughout the facility.
- 22. Observed reclamation pad (treatment and processing) operations.
- 23. The picking line was in operation during part of the inspection. Reclaimed materials were being sorted to stockpiles during the inspection.
- 24. A dumpster is located at the reclamation pad and on the landfill for disposal of any incidental unacceptable materials, such as fast-food containers, found in incoming loads.
- 25. Windblown materials effectively controlled by utilization of fences at the treatment and processing area, no fugitive dust problems were observed.
