You are hereby advised that, pursuant to N.C.G.S. 130A-22, an administrative penalty of up to \$15,000 per day may be assessed for each violation of the Solid Waste Statute or Regulations. For the violation(s) noted here, you may be subject to enforcement actions including penalties, injunction from operation of a solid waste management facility or a solid waste collection service and any such further relief as may be necessary to achieve compliance with the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Act and Rules.

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AREAS OF CONCERN AND COMMENTS:

1. Facility began operations November 2, 2004 as a Municipal Solid Waste Transfer Station.
2. Approved disposal location for the waste transferred from the facility is the Uwharrie Environmental Landfill, Montgomery County, Permit # 62-04.
3. The permitted service area for the transfer station is defined as all North Carolina counties within a 50-mile radius of the facility, and includes the counties of: Alamance, Cabarrus, Caswell, Chatham, Davidson, Davie, Durham, Forsyth, Guilford, Harnett, Iredell, Lee, Moore, Montgomery, Orange, Person, Randolph, Rockingham, Rowan, Stanley, Stokes, Surry, Wake, Wilkes, and Yadkin.
4. The approved location for maintenance of facility operational records is on site at 2104 Bishop Road.
5. Conducted review of the facility Permit to Operate, Operational Plans and Operational Records.
6. Reviewed current random inspection program and logs. Random inspections are conducted at a rate of one per day, insuring a minimum of one percent of incoming loads are inspected. The facility also maintains load refusal logs for unacceptable waste delivered to the site.
7. The facility receives and processes an average of approximately 500 tons per day of municipal solid waste. The facility also receives approximately 100-150 tons per week of collected recyclables (residential and commercial recycling routes) which is delivered to Sconoco for processing.
8. Annual Facility Report review for the 2009-2010 indicated the facility has received 127,529.31 tons of waste during reporting period. Approximately 80% of the waste received by the facility is generated in Guilford County, 15% generated in Alamance County, the remaining waste was received from Randolph, Davidson, Orange and Rockingham Counties.
9. Transfer Station and Facility inspections are conducted monthly by Republic Services staff for safety and environmental compliance issues.
10. Transfer station training records include the following SWANA operator certifications:: Transfer Station Operations Specialist – Arthur Harrington, expiration date 11/26/10; Carl Rhodes, expiration date 12/05/11; Harold Brundage, expiration date 06/17/13; Phillip Guerrero, expiration date 06/17/13; Franklin May, expiration date 04/14/12; and Transfer Station Manager- Jimmy Torrey, expiration date 02/27/12.
11. Observed transfer station operations.
12. There was minimal waste on the tipping floor during the time of the inspection.
13. All waste is removed from the tipping floor at the end of each day.
14. The transfer trailer loading bay is typically cleaned of litter every two to three out-going loads.
15. Areas behind tipping floor barriers and the transfer trailer loading bay were free of accumulated debris.
16. The tipping floor is cleaned daily.
17. The facility conducts a full wash down each Friday and contracts quarterly for a floor to ceiling power washing.
Note: Section 3.2 of the approved Operations Plan states “The facility shall maintain a record of all monthly clean-up activities in the facility operating record”. These records should be updated as clean-up activities occur.
18. Windblown materials and litter at the site is well controlled, roadways and fence lines were clean of windblown litter.
19. There are containers on site for collection and storage of metals and tires, which are removed from incoming waste during the individual load screening process.
20. An additional container has been placed for collection of incoming wood pallets. The collected pallets are to be sent to a nearby facility for processing.
21. Leachate generated at the facility is collected by floor drains in the transfer station. The leachate collection system is connected to the City of Greensboro sanitary sewer.
