Dear Mr. Womble:

Enclosed please find a amended Solid Waste Permit and Conditions of the Solid Waste Permit for the scrap tire collection and processing and recycling facility. The Solid Waste Section (the Section) has reviewed the information dated 1 October 2002 and CCTD's compliance record and determined that permit 43-08 can be renewed for a additional three years consistent with .1106 (a).

This revised permit is the result of a request to add a Columbia Corporation 42' Heavy Duty Low-Profile, hydraulic trailer tipper for unloading tire trailers and to provide for additional locations for the storage of incoming tires. The tire storage limit for this facility remains at 23,076 tires(based on a Letter of Credit in the amount of \$150,000) and shall store said tires in accordance with the permit renewal application drawing dated 1 October 2002 and permit condition 6(g).

CONDITIONS OF PERMIT

1. This permit is re-issued for a period not to exceed three (3) years from the date of issuance and/or amendment and will expire on 14 November 2006, subject to condition number 2. This permit is for the operation of the scrap tire collection site set forth in the original and renewal applications. Additional conditions or revisions to the approved plans or operations must be approved by the Solid Waste Section.

Amendments or revisions to the Solid Waste Management Rules or violation of surface water, groundwater, or land quality standards may necessitate modification of construction, operation, or closure of this facility prior to the expiration date of this permit.

2. This tire collection site is permitted to store, prior to processing, not more than twenty-three thousand and seventy six (23,076) tires. Proof of closure, clean up, and liability financial assurance, including pollution coverage, must also be submitted at that time for the potential amount of storage equal to the monthly processing amount. See Letter of Credit issued by CENWEST Bank, LETTER OF CREDIT NO. 277, dated 11 July 2001, automatically renewable on an annual basis. Subsequent adjustments to the storage amount and financial assurance amounts require approval of the Solid Waste Section.
3. A minimum of seventy-five percent (75%) of tire derived products must be disposed in Central Carolina Tire Disposal's tire monofill or shipped off-site on an annual basis. Adjustments to this percentage to allow additional amounts of storage or adjustments to allow additional length of storage time must be approved by the Solid Waste Section.
4. Closure and clean up financial assurance must remain in force during the operation of this site and is subject to Condition Number 2. Central Carolina Tire Disposal must submit to the Division for approval, any subsequent changes in the instrument or provider of financial assurance at least one-hundred-twenty (120) days prior to said change. **This permit is immediately revoked if any lapse of closure and clean up financial assurance occurs.**

5. Liability financial assurance must remain in force during the operation of this site and is subject to Condition Number 2. Central Carolina Tire Disposal must submit to the

Division for approval, any subsequent changes in the instrument or provider of liability financial assurance, at least one-hundred-twenty (120) days prior to said change. **This permit is immediately revoked if any lapse of liability financial assurance occurs.**

6. This facility shall conform to the operating procedures set forth under section 0.1107 of the Solid Waste Management Rules and the following specific conditions:
 - a. Within one (1) month after termination of operations at the site or a major portion thereof or upon revocation of this permit, all scrap tire and scrap tire derived products shall be removed to a permitted solid waste management facility approved to receive this type of waste.
 - b. The Division may require further action to be taken in order to correct any condition which is or may become injurious to the public health or environment.
 - c. Adequate fire protection measures shall be in place and fire prevention procedures shall be practiced at all times. Equipment shall be provided to control accidental fires or arrangements shall be made with the local fire protection agency to immediately provide fire-fighting services when needed.
 - d. Adequate control measures and practices shall be employed to prevent any pollutants from contaminating surface water, groundwater, and soil.
 - e. A copy of the Emergency Preparedness Manual must be kept readily available to employees on the site at all times.
 - f. The site shall be adequately secured to prevent unauthorized entry. An attendant shall be on duty at the site at all times while it is open for public use to assure compliance with operation requirements.
 - g. Tires and tire chips shall be stored as shown in the revised site plan application dated 1 October 2002. Original plans dated 30 October 1994 address work/storage area, those tire storage areas North, South and East of the work/storage area, and in accordance with the original permit application. Any proposed changes in storage or procedures shall require approval by the Solid Waste Section. Outdoor tire storage shall comply with 15 NCAC 13B .1107 (2). Stakes or posts shall be installed to delineate the tire storage areas and the tire chip pile storage areas as shown on the 1 October 2002 site plan.
 - h. The Irrevocable Standby Letter Of Credit, No. 277, issued on 11 July 2001 by CENWEST Bank shall be renewed by B.T. Sanitation Service, Inc. dba Central Carolina Tire Disposal and a letter submitted to the Division of Solid Waste by 15 August 2004 and each year thereafter.
7. A report shall be submitted annually on March 1 to the Division and to Harnett County containing the information required under 15A NCAC 13B. 1110 (d).

8. A sign with the name of the facility and permit number must be erected and maintained at the entrance of the facility.
9. In accordance with 15 NCAC 13B 0.1102 (b), Scrap Tire Collection or Disposal Sites shall pay an annual permit renewal fee, by July 1, of each year, as specified:
 - (1) A scrap tire collection site: two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00); and
 - (2) A scrap tire disposal site: two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).

1. Amendment #1: Addresses that changes in storage areas at the tire processing facility in accordance with the application and plans dated 30 October 1994.
2. Amendment #2: Addresses the increase of financial assurance from \$75,000 to \$150,000 based on the revised IRREVOCABLE STANDBY LETTER OF CREDIT NO. 3880, received 17 February 1995 and faxed to the F.R.O on 01 March 1995.
3. Amendment #3: Permit renewal application dated 11 January 2000 and received 14 February 2000 for renewal of site storage and processing permit. Amendment #3 for this site is for the future tire chip storage area located to the south of the processing area. The tire chips to be stored will be marketed as septic drain field aggregate. Also included with the renewal application is Letter of Credit Number 2000-10 from Century Bank dated 26 January 2000.
4. Amendment #4: New letter of credit issued by Comerica Bank, LETTER OF CREDIT NO. 561029-03, that replaces the letter of credit issued by Century Bank dated 26 January 2000.
5. Amendment #5: Revised site plan addressing the location of new tire chippers, for making tire chip for market as drainage media for septic systems and landfills, and the location of tire storage areas along with tire chip storage areas.
6. Amendment #6: Revised site plan addressing the location of a new trailer tipper and the addition of new tire storage locations, along with the three year review/renewal of permit 43-08. New letter of credit from CENWEST Bank, LOC #277 dated 11 July 2001 and automatically renewable on 11 July of following years.
