The Solid Waste Section (Section) has reviewed the *Haywood County Construction and Demolition Debris Landfill Leachate Seep Assessment for White Oak Landfill* submitted by Mountain Environmental Services, Inc. on behalf of Haywood County dated March 27, 2009.

An additional groundwater monitoring event was conducted at the facility on March 12, 2009. As previously requested by the Section, monitor wells MW-15 and PZ-9 were re-sampled to determine if 2-butanone (MEK) remained present at detectable concentrations. 2-butanone (MEK) was not reported above laboratory detection limits in either groundwater sample.

Based on the results of the monitoring event, Haywood County will not be required to conduct additional assessment or monitoring related to leachate seeps discovered in March 2008.
