AREAS OF CONCERN AND COMMENTS:

May 5, 2011

Inspected the BMWNC, Inc. Medical waste incinerator, Solid Waste Permit Number 60-09-I, located at 3250 Campus Ridge Road to determine whether the facility is operating in compliance with the operating permit and conditions outlined in the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules.

Weather: Clear and approx. 75° F at 2:00 PM

Observations: Facility was not operational during inspection.. The facility will not be receiving waste any time in the near future due to corporate re-structuring. All waste diverted to Steri-Cycle.

There were no trailers on site.

The receiving area floor appeared to be maintained in a sanitized condition.

Cart wash has been shut down due to no material being received.

Facility has been receiving waste for the USDA which consists of out of country waste which is generated on cruise ships and shipped from the Port of Charleston. The reception of this USDA waste is in the new permit.

REVIEW OF SPECIFIC PERMIT CONDITIONS and LIMITATIONS:

S-1 thru S-3 Define the permit and applicable definitions.

S-4 "The facility shall conform to the operating procedures described in the approved operating plan, in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .1206- "Requirements for Storage of Regulated Medical Waste.

S-5 "The facility shall conform to the requirements of 15A NCAC 13B Rule .1207(1)(a-j) - "Operational Requirements/Regulated Waste Treatment Facilities" for all regulated medical waste treated at the incineration facility.

S-6 "The facility shall conform to the incineration operating procedures described in the approved plan, in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .1207(3)- Operational Requirements/Regulated Medical Waste Treatment Facilities".

- Facility was operating in general compliance incineration requirements outlined in Rule .1207(3).

S-7 "The Facility shall conform to the ash management procedures described in the approved plan, in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .1207(3) - "Operational Requirements/Regulated Medical Waste Treatment Facilities"."

- All containers had good seals.

S-8 "This facility shall conform to the ash sampling procedures described in the ash sampling procedures described in the approved plan, in accordance with 15A NCAC 13B .1207(3) - "Operational Requirements/Regulated Medical Waste Treatment Facilities"."

S-9 "This facility shall conform to the reusable cart sanitation operating procedures described in the operating plan"

- Facility appears to be conforming to the reusable cart sanitation plan, though none were being used at this time.

S-10 "BMWNC, Inc. Personnel shall inspect each load of waste deposited on the site for acceptability prior to treatment"

-No loads being received at the facility..

S-11 "Equipment shall be provided to control accidental fires....."

-Fire extinguishers are located in strategic areas in facility.

S-12 "Fires shall be reported to LUESA Solid Waste Division as soon as practical.

-No fires outside of the incineration unit have been reported.

S-13 "Facilities or practices shall not cause a discharge of pollutants into the waters of the State...."

-No discharge of pollutants to a water of the State was apparent.

S-14 Records of the amount of waste received at the facility shall be maintained and categorized according to the type of waste, State of origin, and North Carolina County of Origin.

S-15 On or before February 15 of each year, the permittee shall submit a report to NCDENR indicating the amount of waste received and incinerated....."

Compliance with Solid Waste Management Rules

15A NCAC 1207(1):

(a) "Refrigeration at an ambient temperature between 35° and 45° Fahrenheit shall be maintained for regulated medical waste not treated within seven (7) calendar days after shipment."-

(b) "Regulated medical waste shall be stored prior to treatment no more than 7 days after receipt."

(c) "Regulated medical waste shall be stored no longer than 7 days after treatment."

- Ash (treated regulated medical waste) is routinely moved off the site weekly or as needed.

(d) "Only authorized personnel shall have access to areas used to store Regulated medical waste".

- No unauthorized persons were observed in waste storage areas.

(e.) "Areas used to store Regulated Medical Waste shall be kept clean. Neither carpets nor floor coverings with seams shall be used in storage areas. Vermin and insects shall be controlled."

- Waste storage and staging areas were judged to be clean. No floor coverings are used in the storage area.

(f) "Prior to treatment, all medical waste shall be confined to the storage area."

-No untreated waste was observed stored outside the storage area or closed trailers.

(g) "All floor drains shall discharge directly to an approved sanitary sewage system. Ventilation shall be provided and shall discharge so as not to create nuisance odors."

-Floor drains are plumbed to discharge to the quench water system. No nuisance odors were detected. Ventilation system was functioning.

(h) "A plan shall be prepared, maintained, and updated as necessary to ensure continued proper management of regulated medical waste at the facility."

- Plan maintained at the facility has been updated and all updates from Plant Manager are kept in permanent facility file at LUESA offices.

(i) "Records of Regulated medical waste shall be maintained for each shipment"

- There were no records for shipments of waste at the facility.

(j) "Regulated medical waste treatment facilities that treat waste generated off-site shall submit to the division an annual report by August 1 of each year....."

-Facility has submitted report to NCDENR for FY 2008-09. The FY 2009-10 report has been received by this department.

15A NCAC 13B Section .1207(3):

(a) "Regulated medical waste shall be subjected to a burn temperature in the primary chamber of not less than 1200° Fahrenheit."

- Direct read and recorders indicated UNIT 1 was off line. Unit 2 is off line.

(b) "Automatic auxiliary burners which are capable, excluding the heat content of the wastes, of independently maintaining the secondary chamber at the minimum 1800 Degrees Fahrenheit shall be provided."

-Auxiliary burners were not functioning.

(c) "Gases generated by the combustion shall be subjected to a minimum temperature of 1800° Fahrenheit for a period of not less than one (1) second."

- Incinerators are designed to meet the required retention time.

(d) "Continuous monitoring and recording of primary and secondary chamber temperatures shall be performed.

(e) "An air quality permit shall be obtained from the Division of Environmental Management prior to construction and operating."

- The air quality permit has been issued by the Air Quality Section of Mecklenburg County LUESA.

(f-k & m) "A plan of procedures for obtaining weekly and monthly composite ash samples shall be submitted....."

-Facility needs continue ash sampling and reporting as required when operations resume.

(l) "Records of stack testing as prescribed in the Air Quality Permit shall be maintained at the facility.

-Records are maintained as required.
