**Red Rock Disposal C&D Landfill**

**Description**

Red Rock Disposal, LLC has applied for an increase in the service area of the Red Rock Disposal Construction and Demolition Debris (C&D) Landfill. The C&D landfill is currently approved to accept waste generated within Wake County and contiguous counties (8 counties). The proposed new facility permit would allow the facility to accept waste generated within 59 North Carolina counties which are predominantly within a one hundred mile radius of the landfill. No changes are proposed, at this time, to increase the size of the landfill or to increase the volume (tons per day) that the facility is permitted to receive.

The Red Rock Disposal C&D Landfill is owned by Red Rock Disposal, LLC, a subsidiary of Waste Industries, Inc, and is located south of Rex Road, at 7130 New Landfill Road, southwest of Holly Springs and west of Fuquay-Varina in Wake County.

The currently approved service area of the facility consists of Chatham, Durham, Franklin, Granville, Harnett, Johnston, Nash, and Wake Counties. The proposed new facility permit would allow the facility to accept waste generated within the following North Carolina counties (including the currently approved eight counties): Alamance, Anson, Beaufort, Bertie, Bladen, Brunswick, Cabarrus, Caswell, Chatham, Columbus, Craven, Cumberland, Davidson, Davie, Duplin, Durham, Edgecombe, Forsyth, Franklin, Granville, Greene, Guilford, Halifax, Harnett, Hoke, Iredell, Johnston, Jones, Lee, Lenoir, Martin, Mecklenburg, Montgomery, Moore, Nash, New Hanover, Northampton, Onslow, Orange, Pender, Person, Pitt, Randolph, Richmond, Robeson, Rockingham, Rowan, Sampson, Scotland, Stanly, Stokes, Surry, Union, Vance, Wake, Warren, Wayne, Wilson, and Yadkin. No out-of-state waste is proposed.

In 2001, the Wake County Board of Commissioners approved a franchise for this facility that allowed the disposal of 200 trucks per day, average 2,000 tons per day, based on 286 operating days per year. Since this time, the facility has averaged 60 trucks per day, and about 600 tons per day, significantly below the allowable. With the proposed increase in service area, the facility will not exceed the volume allowed by the franchise of 2,000 tons per day.

The Division has determined that the application for change in service area, which is a substantial amendment to the permit, complies with the requirements of the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules as codified in Solid Waste Management Rules 15A NCAC 13B .0531, et seq.

The Division of Waste Management has prepared a draft permit that is now available for public review and comment. The change in service area is the only proposed change to the facility operation at this time.

The Red Rock Disposal C&D Landfill is permitted to dispose of construction and demolition debris, inert debris, land clearing debris, and asphalt. The facility property consists of approximately 225 acres, including buffer areas. The total disposal area consists of approximately 118 acres. The landfill has approximately 20 years of remaining operating life.

### **Permit Structure**

The permit is divided into two parts, the Permit to Construct, and the Permit to Operate. Each includes a list of Approved Documents, and specific conditions for the construction, operation, and monitoring of the landfill units. Owners are required to submit Permit Amendment applications for construction and operation of each stage of operation. Permits to Operate are issued for 5 year increments of operation.

### **Public Comment Period**

North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules require that the public be given an opportunity to comment on a draft permit for a substantial amendment to a C&D landfill. The 45-day comment period for this permit action begins on April 7, 2008, and ends at 5:00 p.m., May 21, 2008.

The application and draft permit is available for review by appointment from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday, at the Division of Waste Management, 401 Oberlin Road, Raleigh, NC. Information submitted by the applicant in support of this permit action is available for public review as part of the administrative record. A portion of the administrative record, including the application and draft permit, may be viewed online at <http://www.wastenotnc.org/sw/swdocuments.asp> (select 9228 in the permit box, then click Search Documents).

Written comments must be sent to the address shown below and should include the permit number. All comments received within the 45-day period will be considered in making the final determination regarding the permit.

A public hearing has not been scheduled for this permit. However, during the public comment period any interested person may request a public hearing. A request for public hearing shall be in writing and shall state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing.

After the close of the public comment period and after consideration of all comments, the Solid Waste Section will issue a permit decision. Each person who has submitted a written request for notice of the permit decision shall receive written notification of the decision.
