Pursuant to good business practices and a good faith desire to be a valued working partner with the State of North Carolina; therefore PCM Construction Services proposes the following changes to its Apex, North Carolina Transfer Station facility which is documented on the accompanying architectural drawing


1. Proposed use of existing building for cardboard recycling.
 - a. Siting of cardboard bailer's
 - b. Cement ramp for loading bailed cardboard for transport to recycling facility
2. Proposed use of existing building for storage of clean recyclable lumber prior to transport to Habitat for Humanity.
3. Continue to use existing traffic pattern for delivery of C&D materials.
 - a. Use original unloading area as "Main" sorting area.
 - i. Brick and block sorted to east end of ramp.
 - ii. Wood sorted and moved south of second ramp.
 - b. Sort area south of ramp for wood.
 - i. Clean reusable wood removed and stored in aforementioned existing structure. Then transported to Habitat for Humanity.
 - ii. Unusable wood ground SE of ramp and removed to recycling center.


