Hey Andy:

Based on what Ben told me over the phone this afternoon, I understood that the Wilson County CDLF is planning to use the to-be-constructed "Comingled" Recycling Transfer Building to handle recyclable material such as newspaper, plastic/glass bottles, dry wall panels and so on, not the separated wastes regulated by the Solid Waste Management Rule (Rule) such as used tires, scrap metal, white goods, wastes for composting. The Solid Waste Section will not regulate recyclable units which are not required by the Solid Waste Management Rule and NC General Statutes.

Therefore, I suggest that we can handle this issue via an official letter request, not a permit modification (no permit modification fee and no issuance of a revised permit). Below are my suggestions to proceed this matter:

1. Wilson County issues a letter to inform the Solid Waste Section that a new equipment shop and a comingled recycling transfer building will be constructed at the landfill. Please describe the permitted wastes stream will be handled in the transfer building, and the estimated amount of wastes can be handle in the period of time, the information of the contractor (e.g. Sonoco) – address, contact info (name, phone, fax, e-mail etc.)
2. Please provide the Solid Waste Section the locations of the proposed equipment shop and transfer building on the Facility Plan drawing (by scale); hand sketch on the existing Facility Plan drawing is acceptable.
3. Wilson County will update the new buildings to the next Permit Amendment Application.

Please be aware that if the roof shingles are the wastes to be recycled (used as pavement/asphalt additive) in the transfer building, the Solid Waste Section needs to know the details of the waste operation, and the permit modification application may be required as well. Because the shingle may contain regulated asbestos material, comingling processes (including sorting, processing and/or grinding the material) may expose asbestos to the workers. If County plans to recycle roof singles inside this transfer building, please contact Ms. Pat Backus, P.E. who can be reached at 919-508-8502 or pat.backus@ncdenr.gov to obtain more information.
