

Conditions of Permit

1. This facility shall be constructed in accordance with the Solid Waste Compost Rules (15A NCAC 13B, Section .1400), the approved plans and the conditions of this permit. Any proposed modifications to the approved plan will require prior approval by the Solid Waste Section.
2. All sedimentation and erosion control activities shall be conducted in accordance with the plan approved by the Division of Land Resources and the Sedimentation Control Act (15 NCAC 4).
3. Ted Lyon, Composting and Land Application Branch Supervisor, shall be contacted prior to the start of facility construction. The construction site shall be accessible to Solid Waste Section staff during regular working hours.
4. The Division shall receive written certification that the facility was constructed in accordance with the approved plans and as built drawings shall be submitted prior to obtaining a permit to operate.
5. Prior to receiving any waste at this facility a permit to operate a Solid Waste Compost Facility shall be obtained. Requirements for a permit to operate are located in .1405(c) of the Solid Waste Compost Rules.
6. A pre-operation inspection and meeting shall be conducted prior to receiving any waste at the facility. Operation plans will be reviewed with Field Operations staff at that time.
