The Division of Waste Management, Solid Waste Section (Section) has received your request for permit amendment for the Fogleman & Fogleman Soils, Inc. Landfill (Permit No. 32-F) and the appropriate permit fee.

Your application can now be considered complete within the context of NCGS §130A-295.8(e). A determination of completeness means that the application includes all required components but does not mean that the required components provide all of the information that is required for the Section to make a decision on the application. A technical review of your application is in progress.

Under NCGS §150B-3, when an applicant makes a timely and sufficient application for issuance or renewal of a permit, the existing permit does not expire until a final decision on the application is made by the Division. Therefore, until the final decision is made, you are authorized to continue operation of the Fogleman & Fogleman Soils, Inc. Landfill in accordance with your most recent Solid Waste Permit and the Solid Waste Management Rules (15A NCAC 13B).
