

The Solid Waste Section has prepared draft Solid Waste Permit Number 33-01 to allow the Edgecombe County Construction and Demolition Debris Landfill (C&DLF) unit to continue operations pursuant to the North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules, 15A NCAC 13B .0547(4). The 21.2-acre C&DLF unit owned and operated by Edgecombe County is located on 2872 Colonial Road (State Route 1601), Tarboro, North Carolina 27886. The C&DLF unit is located on top of the 68-acre closed Municipal Solid Waste Landfill (MSWLF) unit and has a gross disposal capacity of approximately 1.7 million cubic yards. In addition to the C&DLF, the draft permit also includes conditions for operating miscellaneous waste management units at the facility. Impact to groundwater from the closed unlined MSWLF requires the implementation of a corrective action plan. An assessment of corrective measures for groundwater treatment was presented at the public meeting held on August 4, 2008. Monitored natural attenuation coupled with in-situ isolation by installing a groundwater barrier wall and with stormwater improvement on the western half of the landfill was the selected remedy. The ..

draft permit contains conditions for the implementation, operation, and assessment of the corrective action plan.

North Carolina Solid Waste Management Rules require that the general public be given a 45-day period to comment on this draft permit. The comment period will begin on January 10, 2010, and end at 5:00 PM on February 23, 2010. Comments should be submitted in writing to Ming-Tai Chao, division contact, at the address listed above.

All data submitted by the applicant is available as part of the administrative record and may be reviewed during business hours (9 a.m. - 4 p.m., Monday-Friday, by appointment) at the Division of Waste Management, 401 Oberlin Road, Suite 150, Raleigh, North Carolina.
