

Dear Mr. Adu-Poku,

Please find enclosed an updated Operations Plans for the Rocky Mount LCID. Amendments to the Operations Plan address those items raised in your May 27, 2009 memo. Specific responses to these items are noted below:

- 1. Please include a description of the signs to be posted at the entrance and within the site to direct traffic. Signs must provide a description of the type of waste received, the types of waste prohibited, operating hours, permit number, and emergency contact numbers.**

A schematic of the signs to be posted at the site are included in Appendix A of the LCID Operational Plan.

- 2. Include a description of site security and access control.**

A section has been added within the Operations Plan to address this request.

- 3. Include recordkeeping and contingency plans in the Operation Plan.**

This is addressed in the "Emergency Contingency Plan" section of the Operations Plan.

- 4. Personnel requirement, qualification, and responsibilities. The plan must indicate that a trained employee must be onsite at all times the site is open.**

A section has been added to the Operations Plan to address the personnel requirements and responsibilities. We do not, however, have an interest in posting an employee on site between the hours of 7:30 AM and 6:00 PM Monday through Friday. The LCID is not open to the public or outside contractors and access to the site is restricted through use of a second gate that is unlocked and locked after each use. It is our hope that this approach to managing the site eliminates the need for an onsite employee.



- 5. According to the rule 15A NCAC 13B. 0564 "Siting Criteria for Land Clearign and Inert Debris (LCID) Landfills", information showing that the bottom elevation of the waste shall be four feet above the seasonal high water table is required. Please modify the design plan to depict this information.**

Offsite fill has been added in the currently active cell to provide a minimum of 4 foot of separation from the ground water table per the approved plan. This is noted on the cross-section for Phase VII of the LCID enclosed with the Operations Plan.

- 6. Provide a map or aerial photograph with a scale of at least one inch equals four hundred feet showing the area within one-fourth mile of the site. The map must include, but not be limited to all homes, buildings, public or private utilities, roads, wells, wasterways, and any other applicable features.**

- 7. Submit a cover letter and an electronic copy of all the required documents on a CD or by email, whichever works best for you.**

Enclosed as requested.

I trust the responses above and the additional information provided in the updated Operations Plan for the Rocky Mount LCID Landfill, adequately address those issues identified in your May 27, 2009 correspondence. Should you require any additional information, however, please advise.
