Dear Mr. Petty:

Your recent request to have the above referenced mining permit modified has been approved. The modification is to change the design of Sediment Basin No.1 to move the basin out of the newly established floodplain boundary as indicated on the Proposed Mining, Sedimentation and Erosion Control Plan last revised January 22, 2003. In addition, this modification requires that adjustments be made at the site in the installation of Sediment Traps G and B. Sediment Trap G shall be relocated approximately 75 feet west into the natural drainage feature adjacent to the currently approved location in order to be more effective. Sediment Trap B and its diversions shall be relocated north of the existing sewer line right of way so as not to encroach on said right of way.

In addition to the above, please be aware that a Notice of Violations of the conditions of Mining Permit No. 41-22 is in the process of being issued to your company as a result of buffer zone violations and lack of erosion and sediment control at this site. Your company will be required to re-establish all buffer zones and establish erosion and sediment control as required by your mining permit for this site. We look forward to your company's timely efforts to bring the site into compliance.

Please attach this approval letter to your existing mining permit for future reference.
The expiration date, mine name and permit number on the permit document shall remain the same as before this modification.

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
